itudes, then works northward.

For the far southern United States, and for us here at the lake, earliest sunrise has already happened. North of the 38th parallel, it takes place a little later.

Don't confuse the date of earliest sunrise with the longest day of the year. That takes place on June 20th — the summer solstice. The sun reaches its highest point north, standing overhead on the Tropic of

Cancer in the western Pacific ocean at the moment of the solstice. We in the north celebrate the longest day and shortest night of the year. While the Sun will rise a bit later on the 20th than it does this week, it also SETS later on the solstice, so the total length of daylight is greatest on that day.

After the solstice, in fact, sunset will continue to occur a bit later each day for another week or so. The date of latest sunset also varies with latitude; the farther north you are, the sooner your latest sunset will occur.

Since most of us are up and about at sunSET instead of sunRISE, the days will still feel as though they're getting longer. And for those on Daylight Saving Time



that really seems like a good deal. (More on time later. You can count on it.) But by the end of June, the Sun will begin to set earlier. In a few weeks, you'll notice that the days just seem shorter than they were during early summer.

Enjoy the show. It's free. And if you're an early bird, enjoy the morning





Do you know who I am?

Saw one last night, the rest must be on the move.

There are over 2,000 known species, not all who posses a signal. Capable of luminous display from when they are just pinsized eggs on through their two-week to two-month life span, the female deposits the eggs in moist soil or on the underside of leaves. The tiny larvae emerge a couple weeks later in another lighted form.

Growing from 1/16th inch to about ½

Growing from 1/16th inch to about ½ inch, glowworms are fierce predators consuming snails, slugs and anthropods. The larvae stuns it's victim with a neuro-toxin that immobilizes and liquefies it's meal. Then it sucks up it's prey like a milk shake.

The larvae grows and glows through summer, then burrows into the soil for winter. Biologists wondered why the eggs and



larvae would light,
thinking it made them
vulnerable. Later they
discovered the eggs and
larvae have toxins that
would make a bird or
frog sick — the display
says "I'm poisonous."

Late the next spring it constructs a

pupal case & crawls inside to metamorphose into a slender winged beetle equipped with a flashlight. What is this little critter now?

It flits about signaling in natural Morse Code trying to find a friend, a mate, saying "pick me." Picking the wrong gal leads to a short date. The large genus Photuris females lure in suitors, overpower them and eat them!

Some species display just after dark; others wait till late into the night. Some species fly low, others drift among the tree tops. Efficient bitty bugs converting 90-98% of energy into cool light (whereas an ordinary incandescent light bulb transforms 3% & loses the other 97% as heat). Their trick is done with a chemical reaction between three organic compounds.

Researchers think some species are disappearing, but none are classified as threatened. Most of the species in North America can be found in the mid-west in moist areas (like the area around Birch Lake) lighting their lanterns on summer evenings.

Personal Water Craft laws summarized

Registration requirement
The owner of a personal watercraft shall file an application with
the secretary of state for a registration number and decal.

The registration must be carried

and displayed upon a peace offi-cer's request.

If the personal watercraft is purchased from a dealer, a 15-day temporary permit may be issued. The permit shall not be renewed or extended.

The owner of the personal watercraft shall permanently paint or attach the registration numbers in block letters on each side of the forward half of the vessel. The numward han of the vessel time home-bers must be as high above the waterline as practical. The registra-tion decal is valid for a three-year period that begins on April 1 and expires March 31 of the third year.

Equipment requirement

Each person on board the per-sonal watercraft must wear a per-sonal flotation device that is not an

Each person 12 years of age or older, riding or being towed, must wear a type I, type II or type III personal flotation device.

Each person less than 12 years of age, riding or being towed, must wear a type I or type II personal flotation device.

A lanyard-type engine cutoff

A lanyard-type engine cutoff switch must be attached to the person, clothing or personal flotation device. The manufacturer must

equip the lanyard for the engine. Each personal watercraft must be equipped with one B1 type fire extinguisher.

Age Requirement

A person shall not operate a personal watercraft if a child under years of age is on board or towed

designee of parent or guardian.
A person under the age of 14 A person under the age of 14-shall not operate a personal water-craft in this state. A person who is 12 but less than 14 may operate a personal watercraft if he or she obtained a boating safety certificate before January 1, 1999.

Persons born after December 31, 1978 shall not operate a personal watercraft unless they obtain a boating safety certificate.

The operators of a personal watercraft must carry their boating safety certificate and display it upon the demand of a peace officer.

Out of state residence
Beginning March 31, 2000, persons who are not residents of this state shall only operate a personal watercraft if they possess one of the following:

-A boating safety certificate.
-A certificate from their state that is substantially similar to the educa-tion and training for Michigan. -A certificate from a course approved by the national association of state boating law adminis-trators education committee that shows completion of a boating or personal watercraft course.

Prohibited operation
A person shall not operate a personal watercraft during the period that begins 1 hour before sunset and ends at 8 a.m.

A person operating a personal watercraft shall not cross within 150 feet behind another vessel. other than a personal watercraft, unless the personal watercraft is

operating at a slow-no wake speed.

A person shall not operate a personal watercraft where the water depth is less than 2 feet, unless 1 of the following exists:

-The personal watercraft is being operated at a slow-no wake speed. -The personal watercraft is being docked or launched.

A person shall not weave through congested vessel traffic while operating a personal watercraft. A person operating a personal watercraft shall not wait until the last possible moment to avoid a col-

A person shall not operate a personal watercraft while carrying more persons than the personal watercraft is designed to carry.

A person operating a personal watercraft shall not disregard the rights or safety of others, nor oper-ate a personal watercraft at a rate of speed or in a manner that endangers

a person or property.

Unless operating in a navigable channel, canal, river or stream, a person who operates a personal watercraft or a person that is being towed by a personal watercraft shall not operate within 100 feet of:

-A dock or raft.

-A buoyed or occupied bathing or swimming area.

-A person in the water or on the water in a personal flotation device.
-An anchored or moored vessel.
-A vessel that is drifting or sitting

dead in the water.

A person who operates a per-

sonal watercraft or a person being towed by a personal watercraft shall not operate within 200 feet of:

-A submerged diver.

vessel engaged in underwater diving activities.

-A flotation device displaying the international diving insignia.

Accidents

A personal watercraft accident involving a vessel or its equipment must be reported as soon as possible to the nearest peace officer if

any of the following conditions

-There is a death or disappearance of a person

-A person is injured.
-There is property damage estimated at \$100 or more
The law also requires that the

operator help other persons affected by the accident, unless it puts his or

by the account interest it puts his of her vessel and passengers in danger. The operator of a personal watercraft that is involved in an accident must show his or her registration to any persons injured or to the owner of any damaged property. The operator must also give his or her name, address and vessel identification to the same persons.

Liability of owner

The owner of a personal water-craft is liable for any injury caused by a negligent operator. It shall be presumed that the personal water-craft is being operated with the knowledge and consent of the owner if it is driven by his or her son, daughter, spouse, father, mother, brother, sister or other immediate member of the owner's family.

A person shall not operate a personal watercraft on the waters of this state if either of the following conditions exists:

The person is under the influence of intoxicating liquor or a con-trolled substance, or both.

The person has a blood alcohol content of 0.10% or more.

The owner of a personal water-craft, or a person in charge or in control of a personal watercraft, shall not knowingly allow the personal watercraft to be operated by a person if the following conditions
