

Have A Safe and Fun Summer!

Fourth of July Regatta provides two days of thrills

Seven Sunfish, two MCs and a Hobie cat from Florida sailed in fresh Southerly breezes for the 4th of July Regatta. There were three races on Saturday morning and two races on Sunday afternoon. Marte Saute ran the committee boat, with help from his son and Dave Olson.

The triangular course for the first two races began at Kiloqua (NE corner), then rounded marks at the Outlet (SW corner), Tannadoonah, returned to Kiloqua and finished at the Outlet. A wind shift caused a change for the final three races to a course beginning at Tannadoonah, to the Outlet, to Kiloqua, back to Tannadoonah, with the finish at the Outlet. Although there were plenty of boat waves accompanying the holiday traffic, there was sufficient wind to drive through them, giving a sensation of sailing in the Gulf Stream.

The two MCs need some of their fellow competitors to join them. The Hobie cat

raced with the MCs, and it was interesting to observe the contest between the superior speed of the catamaran Hobie cat and the superior maneuverability of the monohull MCs.

The Sunfish races were characterized by tight groupings and hard fought finishes. Tom Howard continues to sail in some sort of magical zone of excellence, and only Bob King was able to share any first place finishes with him. Jim Bolinger is making a habit of trouncing the Fleet Captain, and Rick Russwurm is proving to be a natural sailor, causing concern among the oldtimers. The Fleet Captain, in addition to making remarkably poor tactical choices in all the races, managed to disqualify himself in the last race. His post-race review of the rules exploded his erroneous notion that being forced into a buoy by outside forces exonerated him from doing a penalty turn.

The 4th of July races count both for the

Regatta and for the Season standings. To complicate matters, different scoring systems have traditionally been used for the Regatta and for the Season. The Season standings are based on the "square of 40" scoring system, with 1st place getting 1600 points (square of 40), 2nd place getting 1521 points (square of 39) and so forth, the winner being the boat with the highest average. The Regatta uses an "Olympic" scoring formula, where 1st place gets 0 points, 2nd place gets 3 points, third place get 5.7 points, and so on, with the winner being the boat with the lowest number of points. For the Regatta, all boats must sail all races, or receive for missed races the number of points which a boat finishing one place after last place would have received. A disqualified boat also receives the points which a boat finishing one place after last would receive, and boats finishing behind the disqualified boat are moved up one place.





Stu's Star Stuff*

The myths and legends associated with many of the stars and constellations we see each night can be interesting and entertaining. For example, a small semicircle of stars crowns the evening sky right now. It's the constellation Corona Borealis. Although its individual stars are modest, combined they form a striking semicircle - like a crown. It's almost directly overhead around 10 p.m.

The constellation represents the crown of Ariadne, the daughter of King Minos of Crete. According to legend, Ariadne rescued a young Greek man, Theseus, who later

broke her heart.

Greek mythology says that Minos imprisoned the hero Theseus in his labyrinth, which was guarded by the Minotaur. But Ariadne gave Theseus a spool of thread, which he carefully unrolled as he

traversed the labyrinth. Eventually, he found and killed the Minotaur, then followed the string to freedom. Theseus and Ariadne fled from Crete, but he later cast her aside. Moved by the young woman's tale of love and betrayal, Greek goddesses placed her crown in the heavens.

The crown's brightest jewel is a star called Alphecca, which means "brightone of the dish" - a reference to the constellation's obvious bowl shape.

Alphecca really consists of two stars locked in a mutual orbit. One of the stars is a good bit larger, hotter, and brighter than our Sun. The other is quite similar to the Sun. The two stars periodically pass in front of each other as seen from Earth; as they do so, the light we receive from this binary system fades a bit.

Look for the northern crown for the next



few weeks in the evening sky. Follow the handle of the Big Dipper toward Arcturus ("Arc to Arcturus, speed on to Spica"). Corona Borealis will be almost overhead, just east of that line.

Enjoy the show. It's free!

From the Archives...

Lake Notes are compiled from past issues of the Birch Barker. The following tribute was written by Richard Whiteman Sr. and appeared in the July 29, 1978 issue of the Barker.

Tom's Garage

In the small country village of Williamsville thrives a small family operated enterprise known simply as Tom's Garage. If one could go back in time to the days of the village blacksmith, one would encounter an individual such as Tom working at the anvil and forge, shoeing the horses and repairing the wagons and machinery for the townfolk and farmers of the locale.

Although the times are modern, Tom's function is basically the same as the old time "Village Smithy". The maintaining and repair of vehicles used for transportation and farm production are the

prime concern of his business.

The anvil and forge are tools of the past. They have been replaced by sophisticated electric and gas welding equipment. Electric and air powered tools and other work saving devices typical of our modern times are utilized in Tom's normal work day. Tom's shop is located behind his home, making it convenient for lunch time and afternoon naps when business is slow. Surrounding the shop are numerous vehicles in various stages of repair or disre-pair if you vision them in that respect. Various projects lie clustered, in unorganized heaps by the door awaiting their turn to be operated on...by Mr. Fix-It. Somehow the pile never seems to diminish.

Adjacent to Tom's house located on the main arterial street of Williamsville, is his filling station, a Quonset hut type chicken coop, converted into a store. Two gas pumps stand at rigid attention out on the drive awaiting their opportunity to be of service.

Various necessities for the automobile can be purchased from the store. Small children are attracted to the well-stocked candy counter. Bread, milk, ice cream, pizza, and other emergency items are also available.

Normally Mrs. Tom (Betty) and the youngest of her six daughters, (two of the five that are now married served their family in the business), operate the store and pump gas. A sounding device extends across the drive, activating a buzzer in the house, telling Mrs. Tom when she must drop her household chore of the moment to offer her courteous service as a station attendant. Sometimes the customer's waiting time may be lengthened a little due to the dilemmas involved in running a household and pumping gas.

Judging from the outward appearance of this enterprise one might think it rather quaint or country-fied. However, a very definite need of the people of the area is fulfilled. People appreciate the fact that someone is available to assist them when their means of transportation is jeopardized. The little store certainly doesn't compare with the modern supermarket, but to be able to purchase items of necessity and pleasure without having to travel a considerable distance is greatly appreciated.

Author's comment: Congratulations to Mr. & Mrs. Griffith on the completion of their new modern garage. The nostalgia of their original place of business will not soon be forgotten.




