printing the list of *members in good* standing after the 4th of July — Phil was asked to run the list indefinitely. Thanks for your support.




News from "a little corner of heaven"

Bad weather scuttles races


There were no races last weekend due to rain. Tom Howard sailed anyway, which may explain why he wins so often.

From the Birch Lake Archives...

Lake Notes are compiled from past issues of the Birch Barker. The following is from a series of historic pieces, "Gems from Birch Lake," written by Arline Machalleck. It appeared in the June 25, 1988 Barker.

"Lazy Lodge" has a special meaning to the older Birch Lakers and brings back memories of the carefree, good times

and "goodies" bought there.

Peter and Wanda Winarski, back in 1943, bought from the Fulkersons of South Bend, Lazy Lodge. This was a tract consisting of 200 ft. of Lake frontage with a 30x100 ft. building on the Northeast side of the Lake and six cottages on the lots across the road; 42 acres in all.

Pete was a machinist and Wanda a beauty operator from Chicago and they loved the natural beauty of the area and soon many of their friends came to enjoy it with them, renting the back cottages or staying at the main building which slept 24.

Pete and Wanda became permanent residents here in 1947 and opened their concession place the same year, having it for the next 10 years. The concession came about because renting to so many people became too much work, so the beds went out and 15 tables came in.

The first year hotdogs and hamburgers were cooked on kerosene stoves and boy, were the pots and pans black! 100 to 150 hamburgers were sold daily over the weekend. Along with those, ice cream and penny candies were sold. Many a person will drool remembering the fresh strawberry sundaes made from berries they raised themselves and every kid could be seen blowing bubbles supplied by the 500 gum balls Wanda sold each day for a penny apiece.

Wanda became pregnant and in 1951, a son Peter was born. Taking care of the new infant plus all the work of the concession and cottage rentals proved again to be too much work so the large screened porched building was torn down, residence was

established in #6 cottage, known all these years as "The Honeymoon Cottage", and Pete build them a new brick house (E200) which still stands and is occupied by Wanda: Pete died in 1962.


A small concession place was made in the basement of the new house and was popular as the old as it was frequented by kids and parents alike.

The first cottages were sold to the Harrises (E200-2) and the Kellys (E200-4), renters for many years, who later tore down the cottage they bought and built lovely year round homes.

When Wanda was widowed she was faced with lots of problems. Needing to find a job but unable to drive, learning to drive was her first priority and her sister, Jean Hunt and her neighbors have humorous memories of this experience in her open lot in her bright red station wagon.

Instead of working in a factory with the uncertainty of hours and having to hire a babysitter, she was fortunate in being offered a job in the cafeteria of the Constantine School and worked there for 18 years until she retired.

Now Wanda enjoys her home and Birch Lake; her son Peter and his wife, Jan and her four grandchildren, Anna, Daniel, Stephen, and Debrah who all love to come stay with grandma.

Stu's Star Stuff*

The crescent Moon is a beautiful sight over the west side of the lake tonight about an hour after sunset. For the next several nights as the Moon waxes, it appears higher and farther toward the south at the same time of night. Tonight the Moon is a fist's width to the upper left of Spica. To find Spica, follow the arc of the handle of the Big Dipper to Arcturus, then continue that path to the next bright star. "Arc to Arcturus, then speed on to Spica.'


The Moon will be at this same spot in relation to Spica again in 27 and 1/3 days from now. Astronomers refer to this period as the Sidereal Month, the length of time the Moon takes to orbit the Earth, relative to the stars. To go through a complete series of phases, for example, from Full to Full, the Moon requires 29 and 1/2 days, the Synodic Month.

Sunday, the Moon is First Quarter at pre-

cisely 9:02 p.m. EDT, (8:02 IST). Most people think of it as the "half moon" although no such designation exists, much like IST. Tonight the sunrise terminator, the line between light and dark that marks sunrise on the Moon, splits the Moon exactly in two. This is a good time to inspect the craters with binoculars or telescopes, since the lunar sunrise produces shadows that accentuate the features.

An hour before sunrise Mercury can be found low in the ENE, although hard to see from the bowl of the lake. To its upper left are the Gemini Twins, Pollux and Castor. Mercury's orbit is carrying it back toward the Sun, so the swift planet appears lower each morning. A week from now Mercury will pass Mars, but you need to be up early to see either.

Monday the Moon passes from Libra, a faint, obscure zodiac constellation, to



Scorpius, a prominent one. The two brightest stars of Libra (only 3rd magnitude) are a fist's width to the right of the Moon and separated vertically by a fist. Scorpius is to the lower left of the Moon. The most prominent star is Antares, 1 and 1/2 fists (15 degrees) away. Tuesday night the Moon will stand directly above Antares, the heart of the Scorpion, just under a fist (7 degrees) separating them. More on Scorpius later.

Coming soon, a star map we all can use. Until then, enjoy the show. It's free.


