ZEBRA MUSSEL MONITORING & REPORTING PROGRAM

Birch Lake Hosts Zebra Mussels A Hotel Hangs at 189 Piers

"It's a Brick"

Birch Lake is participating in the "Little Zebra Mussel Bricks" program. Birch Lake is the first in the state of Michigan's ten thousand lakes to hang a brick from every pier. Ordinary little house bricks with a length of rope have been distributed by 29 Group Leaders who are responsible for the removal of the brick when the piers go out and responsible for replacement of the brick when the piers go back in. Their lakeside friends and neighbors are responsible for reporting results to them. The Group Leader in turn reports to Gertie Temple for reporting to Michigan Lake and Stream Associations. MLSA is working with the Sea Grant people, a cooperative program of Michigan State University and the University of Michigan.

Egg Stage - An average adult female can produce 30,000 to 40,000 eggs per season.

Eggs are released into the warm vater and the male mussels sense the presence of the eggs around them and release sperm into the water.

Veliger Stage- Several hours after fertilization the veligers emerge. They drift for 3 to 5 weeks before settling and attaching to the brick or other hard surface. They feed heavily on planteon and grow in size.

Post-Veliger Stage - When they become too heavy to remain afloat they settle on the bottom and try to find a hard surface to which they can attach.

Settling Stage - Within the next 3 weeks - post veligers - transform into juvenile forms.

Adult Stage - A Zebra Mussel attains about 2.5 cm (1 inch) in the first year and adds another 1.27 to 2.5 cm during the next year.

Remember - zebra mussel reports from the discovery of zebra mussel colonies found on rocks, clams, docks, boats and equipment are not a part of the official Zebra Mussel Watch Program — the "Mussel Brick" concept.

Equally important to Birch Lake are the findings and destruction of Zebra Mussels, both juvenile and adult, as reported by Bruce Harlan, Julie Ball Lacy and Holly Troeger.

South Shore Mussel report

"The zebra mussel population is alive and thriving in certain parts of the lake. In addition to the residences I am responsible for on the South Shore, where I have found minor involvement on each brick placed on piers, I placed a brick on each end of the Camp Tannadoonah pier complex. Recent inspection proved very little action on these bricks - each one had 2 or 3 juveniles (very tiny 1/8 inch long mussels).\However, while taking the rowboats out for the season, the bottom of one of the boats was covered with literally hundreds of juveniles, very much alive and growing zebra mussels. We quickly destroyed them. This boat had rough scaly paint on its bottom, evidently just the right surface for adhesion and proliferation of the zebra mussel. The other 2 boats were smooth aluminum bottoms and there were no mussels present on either of them. So it is apparent that these little guys will adhere not only to the rough bricks that Gertie and Bob Temple have provided, but also any rough or non-smooth surface. I have also found several fully- grown mussels adhering to our normal lake clam/mussel shells near our waterfront. Two Camp Tannadonah counselors experienced deep scratches from coming in contact with accumulations of zebra mussels on logs while on a canoe trip on the St. Joseph River, to they are not only a scourge to the lakes and rivers but also dangerous from a health standpoint."





Did you ever look up and wonder how far objects in the sky are from Earth? It's amazing how incredibly far away they are. Even the nearest stars are so far away that astronomers don't describe their distances in miles or kilometers. After all, the Sun is 93 million miles away, and the nearest star system BEYOND the Sun, Alpha Centauri, is 25 TRILLION miles away. Every other star in the galaxy is even farther.


Because it's hard to relate to such big numbers, astronomers often use light-years instead. A light year is a unit used to meas-

ure distance. (Sometimes a light year is used to refer to time. This is improper, much like IST that we so often hear about.) One light-year is the distance that light travels in a year. Using this measuring stick, we can say that Alpha Centauri is just over four light years away — because its light takes four years to reach Earth. To put it another way, we see Alpha Centauri as it looked four years ago. When we view objects in the night sky we are actually looking back in time.

Because light travels at 670 million miles an hour, one light-year is immense: almost six trillion miles. Still, there's a way to envision the scale of a light-year using a much smaller unit of distance: the inch.

Imagine shrinking the universe so that the distance between the Sun and Earth was just one inch. On that scale, Pluto would be



only three feet away. But a light-year would equal a full MILE, so Alpha Centauri would lie more than four miles away.

This comparison works because the number of Earth-Sun distances in one light year equals the number of inches in a mile—to an accuracy of better than one percent. No one designed these units to do this, so it's pure luck that they help us to visualize the immense distances between the stars.

Chilled Roasted Tomato & Red Pepper Soup with Mint

2 red bell peppers, quartered and seeded 4 medium tomatoes, halved and cored 1 small onion, cut into 1/2 inch slices 2 large garlic cloves, halved

1-1/2 TLBS Olive Oil 1/2 tsp ground coriander 3/4 cup water

2 TLBS heavy cream

1 tsp fresh lemon juice

1-1/2 tsp salt

1/4 tsp sugar

2 TLBS finely chopped fresh mint

Preheat broiler. Toss bell peppers, tomatoes, onion, and garlic with oil and coriander in a large roasting pan and broil about 4

inches from heat until edges of vegetables are charred, about 7 minutes. Stir vegetables, then broil until vegetables are tender, about 3 minutes more. Puree vegetables with any juices from pan in batches in a blender until smooth. Stir in remaining ingredients except mint.

Cool soup, uncovered, 30 minutes, then chill covered until cold, at least 2 hours. Just before serving, stir in mint.

From the Birch Lake Archives...

Lake Notes are compiled from past issues of the Birch Barker. The following is from a series of historic pieces, "Gems from Birch Lake," written by Arline Machalleck. It appeared in the August 6, 1988 Barker.

The cottage of James and Mary Alyce Thayer (N245) on the North shore has the distinction of being the first cottage on Birch Lake.

Mr. Lyons, who owned the farm on the East side, later the Anderson Farm and now the Curtis' residence (E182), built their cottage in 1918 or 1919 for a Chicago man who later became bankrupt. Making a successful bid of \$500 to \$800, Will A. Thayer, a jeweler from Niles became the new owner.

At this time there was no electricity so gas lights and kerosene stoves were used. The only water on the North side came from artesian wells. On a fifty-foot square of land near the shore, one was capped, named Silver Springs, and was used by the public. This area was later incorporated in the Thayer property and Jim Thayer, present owner of the property said he remembers seeing the original sign under the cottage but was unhappy that it wasn't found during the recent remodeling they did.

Will Thayer camped out at Birch Lake in the early 1900's, coming via U.S. 12 by horse and buggy as M60 was nonexistent at that time.

Will's son, Paul, and later Paul's wife, Irma, and their children, James and Shirley enjoyed their summer retreat and all the good things offered by Birch Lake. An avid fisherman, Paul built a small pool in their front yard, where he kept his catch of trout alive in the icy well water until he was ready to eat them.

When their parents died, Jim and Shirley became co-owners until recently when Shirley moved to Morgantown, N.C. and sold her interest to her brother.

Jim remembers the early cottage, with only dirt to the shoreline and the numerous bullfrogs, cavorting along the shore, many of which became the dinner of the blue racers also waiting there. He remembers the changes made by his parents to the cottage, and he still has his love for fishing and sailing and the wonders of nature instilled by his childhood here. Cisco netting done from Nov. 15 to Dec. 15, now outlawed, and snowmobiling are special adult winter sports he loved to share with his boyhood friends.

After adding two bedrooms and extending their porch across the entire front of the house, Mary Alyce and Jim enjoy sharing with their son, Joe, and his family, the special quarters and lovely view of beautiful Birch Lake.


