

## Stu's Star Stuff Warp speed, Mr. Sulu...



In popular

space operas such as "Star Wars" and "Star Trek," spaceships zip around the galaxy at many times the speed of light by warping the space around them or by traveling through some vaguely defined "hyperspace."

Unfortunately, that's all just fantasy. Scientists have found almost no evidence that any object can travel faster than light. In fact, the speed of light is sometimes described as the universal speed limit. (In addition, travel at speeds even approaching the speed of light is fraught with danger. More on quantum physics, relativity and

space/time later.

Now the speed of light is pretty peppy as eed limits go: 186,282 miles per SEC OND in a vacuum. Notice that we said miles per SECOND, not hour. At that speed, the Moon is only one-and-a-third seconds away; the Sun, just over eight minutes. But even at the speed of light, the next-nearest STAR is more than four years

The speed of light defines one of astronomy's most important units of distance: the light-year. The distances between stars are incredibly vast. Proxima Centauri, the star nearest our Sun, is more than 25 TRILLION

Astronomers need a unit of measurement that's a little easier to handle than miles or kilometers. So they use the distance that light travels in one year: almost six trillion miles — a light-year.

There's no guarantee that the speed of light really is the universal speed limit. The history of science is full of surprising discoveries. But until someone finds evidence to the contrary, the faster-than-light voyages of the Starship Enterprise will remain pure fantasy. For now though, enjoy the show. It's free!



# Best of Beck's Bistro

### Almond-Crusted Salmon with Capers and Lemon

2 Tlbs vegetable oil 2 cups sliced almonds

2 large eggs 3 10-ounce salmon filets (about 1 inch thick), each sliced in half horizontally

3/4 cup fresh lemon juice 4 Tibs capers 6 Tibs (3/4 stick) butter, chilled 6 lemon slices chopped fresh parsley

Preheat oven to 200 degrees. Heat oil in heavy skillet over medium heat. Place almonds in shallow baking dish. Beat eggs to blend in medium bowl. Dip salmon into eggs, tuning to coat: dip salmon into almonds, turning to coat and pressing firmly so that almonds adhere. Place salmon in skillet and cook until opaque in center, turning once, about 5 minutes. Transfer salmon to rimmed baking sheet: keep warm in oven.

Add lemon juice and capers to skillet. Increase heat to medium-high boil until reduced slightly, 1 minute. Add butter, whisking just until melted. Transfer each salmon half to plate. Top with sauce. Gamish with lemon slice and parsley.



#### Peppermint Chocolate Smoothie

6 cups chocolate fat-free skim milk

4-serving size package instant vanilla or chocolate pudding mix

(regular or sugar free) 1/4 tsp peppermint extract Peppermint sticks

In a blender container, combine half of the fat-free skim milk and the pudding mix. Cover and blend until smooth. Pour into a pitcher, stir in the remaining chocolate fat free skim milk and peppermint extract. Refrigerate for at least 1 hour.

To serve, stir mixture; pour into glasses. Gamish each serving with a peppermint stick stirrer. Makes 8 (6 ounce) servings



saw an old friend last week. We had not moved in for the season, but we'd driven up from town to cut the grass, and to enjoy the "kick-start" reawakening that springtime at the lake delivers each year. I parked the car and walked down to the water, and there he stood, hands in pockets, hair blown by the wind, looking exactly as he did when he was alive.

We all delight in the "reconnections" we experience each year here in our warm weather oasis. Summer people like us come back to Birch to open our houses, and year round residents like our younger daughter and her family step outside to talk and to give somebody a hand with a pier or a lift.

Next door neighbors who haven't seen each other in eight or nine months lean on their rakes, and catch up on winter vacation news and child development challenges.

We've all returned to (or remained in) a place we love, and there is comfort in discovering that the things and the people of Birch look pretty much as they did when we left them. "That's good," we say to ourselves.

"It's going to be another great year."

I've "lived" here twice as long as I've lived anyplace else. I disconnect each autumn, packing up and going back to another, less tranquil, home, but throughout a square-dance series of moves to Columbus, Ohio and Chicago and Boston and Mission Viejo and Rancho Mirage, California, and finally, back to South Bend, Birch Lake remained the one geographic constant in my life.

The continuity and the sense of celebration that sit at the heart of the "lake life" experience has tied me to Birch Lake people in a way that I have never experienced elsewhere. These are folks who were around when our children were infants, and who now know the names of our children's children.

My neighbors have watched me grow older and slower in my runs around the lake, and they've witnessed my wife's ability to defy her age and maintain the pace of her flower tending. Perhaps that is why I'm reluctant to turn loose of old friends at Birch just because they have died.

For me a shirtless Jack Hartranft, a cigarette in his mouth, and a lawn mower in his hands will always be a part of life at Birch. I look at Jack today and he still asks me if I'm ever going to "cut down that dirty damn Catalpa tree" that spreads its flowers and leaves everywhere.

Genevieve Lagoni will forever tend her roses here, and Mary Olson will fight off her strokes by riding her bike every day. Leo Zelasko and Harry Price will come sailing in after the morning races while Harry's son Kim does a loop in his speedboat as he drops his daughters into shallow water. I hear Kate Kensill and Nadine Brown laughing and talking many times each summer, and I always see John Brown fiddling with his sprinklers or hold-

ing court with Jack Kensill by the side of the road.

My father-in-law, Starr Wentworth, comes to stand on the end of our pier, and Mrs. Carpenter still gives treats to our daughters as she did when they were little children. Annie Torma calls to me as I run past the place where she lived, and Clem Haines, his white hair brilliant in the afternoon sun, waves me along my way.

I see these folks and many, many, others as surely, and at times, as easily and unexpectedly, as I did when they were living. I turn a corner, or the wind shifts, or I look up at a familiar sound or aroma, and there one of them stands, as vital and as interesting as they were in life.

This "revisiting" is a blessing that is tied to this wonderful place, where people become real and constant to you in a manner and to a degree that is rarely possible in a faster paced, more transient locale. Thank the Lord for Birch Lake and for good people who can stay with you forever





# **Know the Personal Water Craft laws!**

Effective March 31 of last year, the Personal Water Craft (PWC) rules were changed in an effort to mitigate the danger of these high powered vehicles. The combination of pollution & accident statistics caused the state to take action.

Many lake families are scrambling to take a water safety class so the adults can ride the jet skis too (most kids already took the class).

Unless you are up to date - with the required certification — you run the risk of being ticketed and fined.

In addition to classes like the one planned for June 9 at the yacht club, there are web-based safety classes that can help get you up to speed.

Go to: http://www.boatsafe.com

Boatsafe has a course which appears to meet the Michigan & Indiana requirements. The website is user-friendly. The course is recognized / promoted by NASBLA (National Association of State Boating Law Administrators) and recognized by the U.S. Coast Guard. Successful completion of this course may qualify you for marine insurance discounts and meets many states' mandatory boating education requirements.

Should you want further information / clarification contact: IN DNR Law Enforcement Division at 317-232-4010; or the MI DNR at 517-335-3414.

Once you have completed your boating safety class, consider contacting your marine insurance carrier to see if there is a discount available.



# Watch out for these nuisance species

An aquatic nuisance species is a waterborne, non-native species that threatens the diversity or abundance of native species, the ecological stability of infested waters, or a commercial, agricultural, aquacultural, or recreational activity.

In recent years, numerous new non-indigenous species have been introduced in the Great Lakes region creating additional concerns for their cumulative impacts.

Here are a few important tips regarding nuisance species:

- It is extremely important that anglers be aware of these species and take all possible precautions to prevent their spread.
- Remove all visible aquatic plants and animals from your boat, motor, trailer, and accessory equipment before leaving the access area.
- Drain live wells and transom wells thoroughly before leaving the water access area.
- Never dump live bait or fish into any water body.


