

Have A Safe and Fun Summer!

Pluto, the most distant planet in the solar system, is putting on its best showing of the year. It stands opposite the Sun in our sky, so it rises at sunset and remains in the sky all night. It's brightest for the year, too. Unfortunately, it's still too far and too faint to see without a telescope. But we can imagine it in the constellation Ophiuchus, the serpent bearer, which is well to the east-northeast of the Moon.

Lowell Observatory astronomer Clyde Tombaugh discovered Pluto in 1930. A halfcentury later, astronomers discovered that it has a moon. Pluto is less than 500 miles in diameter,

making it the smallest planet in the solar system. Its moon is about half as big as Pluto itself.

Some astronomers think of Pluto and its moon as a double planet. But others think of them in less lofty terms. Pluto's neighborhood is the Kuiper Belt, a ring of small, icy bodies left over from the formation of our solar system. Astronomers who search the outer reaches of our solar system for undiscovered planets have located many small cometary bodies in the once-theoretical Kuiper Belt. So far, none of the new objects qualifies as a "planet." Such searches face a number of daunting obstacles: At such a great dis-

tance, five billion miles or more, even a planet as large as Earth would be almost undetectable and the cold and dark reduce the chance of just "spotting it" to almost zero.

Recently, a small but vocal group of astronomers has turned this question back on itself by asking "Is there a ninth planet?" Pluto, these scientists charge, is in fact a giant escapee from the Kuiper Belt, having more in common with an oversized comet than with a planet. The International Astronomical Union, the clearing-house for the naming and classification of astronomical objects, nevertheless sticks to its guns, and

Pluto remains the ninth, and so far the last, of the known planets.

NASA has worked on several missions to Pluto over the years, but canceled them all. Scientists had hoped to send a probe to Pluto in the next couple of decades to study the planet's atmosphere. As Pluto moves farther from the Sun, its atmosphere will freeze and fall to the surface as snow. The atmosphere won't return until Pluto gets "close" to the Sun again — in 200 years.

Next week, something we can actually see. Until then, enjoy the show. It's free.

BIRCH LAKE AQUATIC PLANT PROJECT

At the annual conference of the Michigan Lake and Stream Associations, a training session was held on Aquatic Plant Identification and Plant Survey. Birch Lake Water Quality Committee representative, Bob Temple, attended the training session presented by Mr. Howard Wandell.

Mr. Wandell retired in 1997 from the Michigan Department of Environmental Quality, where he supervised the Inland Lakes Management Unit and began working with Progressive AE as an aquatic biologist. Howard received his Bachelor and Master Degrees from Michigan State University in Fisheries Science and Limnology.

Mr. Wandell began the position of Michigan State University Extension Agent working with Michigan Lake and Stream Associations under a Memorandum of Understanding between Michigan State University and Michigan Lake and Stream Associations.

At the training session Mr. Wandell said, "We need to claim ownership of our lakes and assume the responsibility that goes with ownership to promote effective resource management. It will not happen unless we make the effort. We need to put knowledge into action to move lake management from a vision to a reality. Only an owner can do it.

Mr. Wandell said, "Build up an historical record for your lake. It is extremely valuable. Water quality data of collected information has a long-term value."

Unlike many lakes, Birch Lake does have a historical record. The data began building in 1978 with the Inland Lakes Watershed Analysis Study. It continued into 1984 and through 1994 with the Cass County Health Department Birch Lake Survey Program. The Health Department set up the Birch Lake Monitoring Program which is on-going. In 1999, the Cooperative Lakes Monitoring Program was added to the Birch Lake Monitoring Program. Data continues to generate and provide a permanent archive which can be referenced at any time.

As you well know, in 1978 the water quality in Birch Lake was Mesotrophic (middle) to very low middle. Because of controlled watershed management, the water quality of Birch Lake has improved to Oligotrophic (top) to high Mesotrophic.

Water quality at Birch Lake can continue to improve. The only "cause" that is out of control in the Birch Lake watershed is identified at lawn fertilizing. Mr. Wandell recommends: eliminate fertilizing and promote buffer zones.

Birch Lake has no septic, agriculture, stream, road runoff or groundwater problem. Birch Lake has no algae bloom of weed growth problem.

Mr. Wandell said, "If you have no yeed problem, still learn about the plants. Every lake needs to have a Milfoil vatch. You need to be able to know what is happening at your lake."

Lakes are like a big garden. Keep the good. Get rid of the bad. Remove the little patch of Milfoil because the next year's patch could be 5 acres. Chemical treatments are costly.- sometimes as high as \$12,000.


Aquatic plant mapping is a parameter often missing in a lake management program. Birch Lake has been chosen to take part in the Cooperative Lakes Monitoring Program's aquatic plant mapping project. During this first year of the pilot project, participation is limited to only three lakes.

Michigan Lake and Stream Associations and Michigan State University has hired Howard Wandell to provide professional assistance to the lakes because the parameter is fairly complicated and time consuming.

The sampling procedures that will be used in the Cooperative Lakes Monitoring Program assessment is written up in the book, "A Citizens's Guide for the Identification, Mapping and Management of the Common Rooted Aquatic Plants of Michigan Lakes, by Wandell and Wolfson (2000)

e was then, as he is now, a tall man, and though I haven't seen him for the past couple of years, I'm certain he is still a handsome man who carries himself with quiet confidence. Jack Asire and his family had only recently returned from Ethiopia where he had been on assignment from TWA to manage Ethiopian Airlines. Jack and Buddy had their place on the West side and Buddy's parents, the Fulmers, had the place in the Cove that is now Marti Asire's home during July and August.

My in-laws, Starr and Millie Wentworth, also spent their summers in the Cove, snugged up in a marvelous little cottage called Add-A-Bit. Shirley Anne had shown enough blind faith in the possibility of human improvement to marry me, and the two of us brought our daughter, Lisa, to visit her grandparents at Birch every chance we had.

I was a young man who knew little, had accomplished almost nothing, and who lived in mortal fear that the world would discover my many shortcomings. Most of the time I did my best to throw the world off the track by behaving as though I knew almost everything about

everything, but was reluctant to discuss it with anyone. It's hard to imagine how I could have been less enjoyable to be around.

My father-in-law, who could have been the poster person for personal development and determination, was a wonderful model for any young man, but when Shirley Anne and I met and married in three months, he had little choice except to welcome me into the family. His acceptance and approval meant a great deal to me, but I realized that he had few options where I was concerned.

Jack Asire was burdened with no such limitations. We had never met, and though I had heard many stories about the quality of his character and the breadth of his accomplishments, I'm certain he had never heard of me. He had no reason to wish me good or bad luck and no need to subject himself to my particular brand of youthful hot air. One Sunday afternoon, the Asires, the Caenepeels, the Fulmers, the Cowens, and the Wentworths gathered for an outdoor potluck dinner at the Cowens' cottage, and since we had come to visit that weekend, we were invited to come along. It was a typical Birch Lake gathering, lots of food, and laughter, with no pretense or formality.

I was nervous whenever I attended events like this one. These people had known my wife all of her life, and I felt certain they could see she had married unwisely. Meeting someone of Jack Asire's stature was particularly nervewracking because he was a celebrity of sorts on the lake, an airline pilot, a successful executive, a man who before the age of 45 had been everywhere and who had accomplished everything he had set out to do. I was certain that such a man would be able to identify my ineptitude at a glance.

As bad luck would have it I found myself seated across from him at dinner, and naturally I could not resist making an ass of myself. I blathered on for almost an hour about whatever stray thoughts passed between my ears. He listened, and nodded, and smiled.

And then something marvelous happened. I ran out of nervous energy and quit talking, and this insightful, kind man began to ask me questions and to tell me stories about himself which made it obvious that he often worried and stumbled and made mistakes. He locked onto me as though I was really worth talking to, and he treated me like someone who stood on the same level of life's playing field with

Through the afternoon and evening I watched him interact with the others at the party, and I saw how thoroughly he concentrated on everyone he encountered. He had grace, and humor, quiet confidence, a complete lack of self-absorption, and a genuine interest in others. "So that's how you're supposed to do it," I remember thinking. "That's the way you're supposed to be." posed to be.

It was many years later before I told Jack what a big influence he had on my life that day. He could not have modeled manliness any better if he had come there with that as his sole purpose, and I will be grateful to him as long as I live.

When I look back over the past 40 years at the pivotal events of my life, I realize that most of them either began or were heavily influenced by some aspect of life on these shores.

Thank the Lord for role models like Jack Asire and for places like Birch Lake (if there are any other places like this one) where awkward, uncertain, but hopeful young people can meet those who can help them along their way.

Personal Floatation Devices

Who must wear a PFD?

- · Children less than 6 years of age must wear a Type I or Type II PFD when riding in the open deck area of a boat. · Each person 12 years of
- age or older operating, riding on or being towed behind a personal watercraft (jet ski) must wear a Type I, Type II or Type III PFD (that is not an inflatable device).
- · Each person less than 12 years of age riding or being towed, behind a personal watercraft (jet ski) must

wear a Type I or Type II

What type of PFD do I need to carry on my boat?

· Vessels less than 16 feet

 Vessels less than 16 feet (including canoes and kayaks) must be equipped with one Type I, II, III or IV PFD for each person on board.

· Vessels 16 feet and longer, in addition to the Type I, II, or III for each person on board must carry one type IV. (Canoes and kayaks over 16 feet are exempt from the Type IV requirement.)
