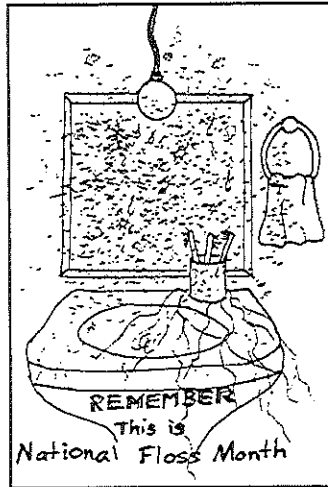
would provide a safe haven.

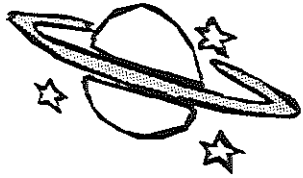

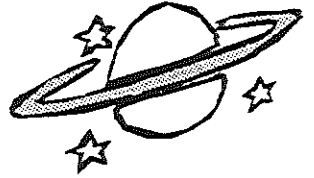

Mars at Opposition



The long awaited Mars opposition occurred on Wednesday of this week. Mars now sits opposite the sun in our sky as seen from Earth. It rises at sunset, sets at sunrise, and crosses due south in the middle of the night. This arrangement happens every 26 months, on average, but not all Mars oppositions are equally interesting. Conditions similar to the present opposition haven't occurred since 1988, when the distance between Mars and Earth was as short as it is now.

An opposition is created when our planet overtakes one of the slower moving planets — those beyond Earth's orbit: Mars, Jupiter, Saturn, Uranus, Neptune, Pluto. Mars oppositions get more attention than the others because we swing much closer to the Red Planet, providing a dramatic change in our view of Mars, both with unaided eye and telescope. As Earth and Mars drew closer together over the last 9 months, Mars has gone from an indistinct magnitude +1.8 object to the current near record-setting -2.4 dazzler. That's a 50-fold increase in

brightness.

While Mars is a celestial eye-popper right now, Jupiter, almost as bright, gets no mention whatsoever. Why should that be? Does Mars have a better press agent? Although Jupiter is bright, it is nearly in the same line of sight as a much brighter object — the sun — and so is unobservable. Early next month we can catch the giant planet emerging in dawn's glow.

Similar to Jupiter's current fate, Mercury is also nearly aligned with the sun and not visible from Earth. Jupiter is, how-

ever, on the far side of the sun, while Mercury is almost between us and our day star, a configuration known as "inferior conjunction." Occasionally the swift-moving planet passes directly between Earth and sun and we witness a transit of Mercury across the sun's disk. The next Mercury transit occurs in 2003. I'll remind you when we get closer to that time. Until then, enjoy the rest of the show. It's free.

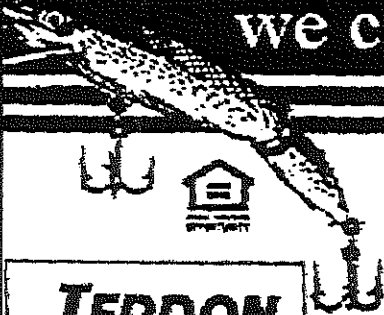

Baby Back Ribs with Orange-Chipotle Glaze (Emeril Lagasse)

4-6 Slabs Baby Back Ribs (10-12 ribs per slab)
Chinese 5-spice powder
Kosher Salt
Coarse black pepper

Preheat gas grill or charcoal to medium high heat. Season ribs liberally on both side with spices. Place ribs on grill and cook 5 minutes per side. Allow ribs to cool completely. Preheat oven to 350 degrees, Wrap ribs in plastic wrap, then in foil, place on a baking sheet and bake at 350 for 1 1/2 hours. Remove from oven and allow to cool while still wrapped.

Orange-Chipotle Glaze:

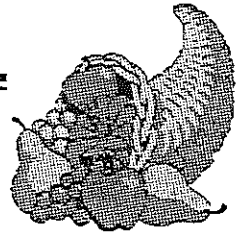
1 cup orange juice
2 cups cider vinegar
1 7oz can chipotle peppers in adobo sauce, pureed in the blender, or finely chopped.
1 cup soy sauce
8 (yes, 8) cups sugar
In a heavy 3 gallon non-reactive stock pot, reduce the orange

juice to 1/4 cup. Add the remaining ingredients, and cook over medium high heat until the sugar has melted and the sauce has reduced to 4 cups and coats the back of a spoon, about 20 to 30 minutes. **NOTE:** be sure to use a large pot as specified, and also watch carefully while reducing the glaze as it has a tendency to boil over.
Yield: 4 cups. This glaze is rather hot!!!

Prior to serving, spoon the glaze over both sides of the ribs. Serve one slab per person and pass the glaze at the table.

Spiced Rum Collins

2 oz Captain Morgan Spiced Rum
1 tsp sugar
Juice of 1/2 lemon
Pour Captain Morgan Spiced Rum over ice cubes in a tall glass. Add sugar and lemon juice. Fill with club soda and stir. Garnish with a slice of lemon or lime.

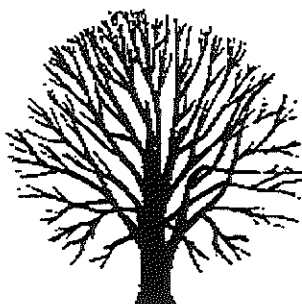

Little Zebra Mussel Bricks Program

During the summer of 2000, Birch Lake participated in the program, and 189 bricks were distributed to the Group Leaders who were responsible for hanging a brick from every pier. Juveniles zebra mussels were found on the bricks. Group leaders also reported finding and destroying the mussels found on rocks, clams, boats, docks, equipment.

This summer, the water quality committee is asking that the GROUP LEADERS PLACE A BRICK ONLY ON THE PIER OF THE GROUP LEADER. They should then:

- 1. Record the date the brick was placed on the pier on an index card or note pad.**
- 2. Monitor the brick periodically.**
- 3. Record the date that juvenile zebra mussels are found and removed from the brick.**

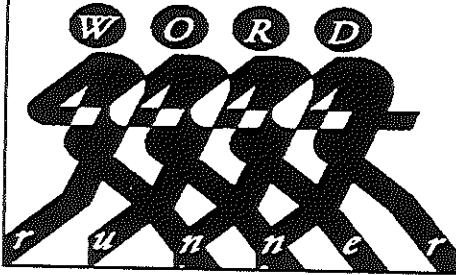
We know that boat owners and anglers are responsible for the spread.

Dog Gone it's hot!

It's rather sad that I am excited about this weeks Fido health tip. Heat Exhaustion means it is finally hot at the Lake. YEA!

Just as human fitness enthusiasts must take additional precautions during the "dog days of summer," we as dog owners must watch over our canine athletes. Canine heat exhaustion, however, is not limited to canine athletes; every dog is a potential victim. Heat exhaustion can advance into heat stroke.

Dogs do not sweat. Their only means of reducing built-up heat is by panting.

There are many variables in triggering a dog to experience heat exhaustion; the dog's physi-

cal condition, its age, its coat length, its breed, etc. An older, couch potato, "snuggle the air conditioner" dog (in Fido's dreams!) will have less tolerance to the heat than a young, romp outside all day, adolescent. Both the very young and very old dogs are among the highest risk categories.

The first signs of heat exhaustion are excessive panting, and/or the skin on the inside of the ears becomes flushed and red.

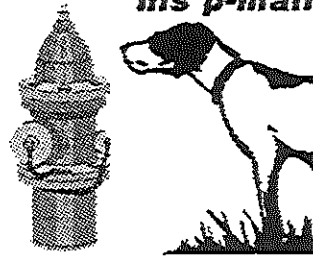
Heat Exhaustion can progress in to Heat Stroke, as indicated by weakness, staggering, and or fainting (loss of consciousness).

Heat stroke is an emergency

situation. If your dog shows signs of heat stroke, you must cool him down as rapidly as possible. Don't wait for veterinary treatment. Do it NOW. Hose the dog down with cool water or simply walk him into the lake. Apply an ice pack to the dog's head if necessary. As soon as it is obvious the dog has cooled off transport the dog to your vet. Heat stroke can leave permanent damage.

Many dogs will play until they drop. You must supervise the games, and determine when it is time to stop. During hot weather limit your dog's time outside. Be sure that there is a shaded area for your dog to rest

in and that your dog has a constant supply of clean cool water. Oh yeah, leash him.

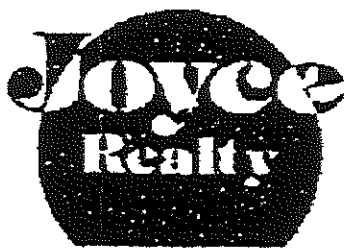

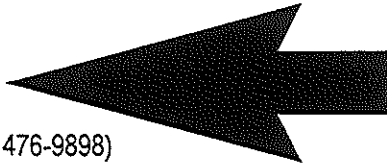
