



Have A Safe and Fun Summer!



Identifying the brightest stars and finding constellations from my home in northern Kentucky is easy. The city lights from nearby Cincinnati drown out all but the brightest stars in the night sky. From near Birch Lake, because light pollution is minimal, there are so many more stars visible that separating out the ones I know is sometimes a challenge.

So how does one go about figuring out which star is which? A good place to start is by finding the Big Dipper, or Ursa Major as it's also known. Look north on any clear evening and it

will be plain to see, high above the horizon. Seven stars form the dipper, 3 for the handle and four make up the bowl. Using the stars in the dipper as pointers, you can easily locate and identify several other bright stars. Two easy ones are Arcturus and Spica (pronounced spike-a). These two stars are often associated together in beginning stargazers' minds because of the way they are located. "Follow the arc to Arcturus and speed on to Spica" is a phrase used to describe the method of tracing a curved line from the Big Dipper's handle through each of the stars.

Using the two bowl stars

opposite the handle as pointers, you can follow a line away from the top of the bowl that will lead you to the North Star. Polaris, as it is also known, marks the end of the handle of the Little Dipper. Ursa Minor is difficult to see in urban areas because the stars are faint, but at the lake it's generally visible. Continue following the same line past Polaris and you will find a crooked letter M formed by five bright stars, Cassiopeia. Throughout the night you can watch Cassiopeia and the Big and Little Dippers wheel about Polaris in the sky.

Over the next several nights watch the waxing gibbous Moon



approach, then pass Mars. Tonight Luna is 30 degrees (three fists) to the brilliant planet's upper right. Tomorrow night the Moon is 18 degrees away, and the following night only 7 degrees separate the two bodies. You'll also see the Moon get bigger and brighter as it approaches full on July 5th. After the fireworks tonight continue looking up. The second part of the show will continue, so enjoy. It's free.

Understanding Birch Lake Phosphorus Data

Birch Lake continues participation in the spring overturn phosphorus monitoring program. Ralph Bednarz, Senior Limnologist, Michigan Department of Environmental Quality (MDEQ) Land and Water Management Division, is the Cooperative Lakes Monitoring Program (CLMP) Coordinator.

Mr. Bednarz tells us that *Spring overturn*, when the lake is generally well mixed from top to bottom, is an opportune time of the year to sample just the surface of the lake to obtain a representative sample for estimating the total amount of phosphorus in the lake.

Bob Temple, CLMP participant, collected the sample on April 9, 2001 over the 95' deep basin of the lake and delivered the frozen sample and data sheet to the MDEQ District Office in Kalamazoo, Michigan on April 10, 2001. The sample is delivered to the DEQ Lansing office where it is analyzed for state recording.

Late summer sampling date is September 23-27 with turn in on the 28th. During late summer when the lake has distinct temperature-defined water layers, the surface grab sample represents only the upper water layer of the lake where most algal productivity occurs.

Phosphorus is the most important nutrient and is often used directly as a measure of eutrophication. Major sources of phosphorus include soil erosion, septic systems and runoff from farmland or lawns. Eutrophic lakes are generally shallow, turbid, and support abundant aquatic plant growth. In deep eutrophic lakes, the cool bottom waters usually contain little or no dissolved oxygen. In reality, lake water quality is a continuum progressing from very good to very poor conditions. Oligotrophic (top) Mesotrophic (middle) Eutrophic (bottom).

Before the Lee Maager Cass County Health Department Birch Lake Survey Program which inspected each lake front property and corrected 96 systems, Birch Lake was classified as Mesotrophic to very low Mesotrophic. The faulty septic systems were deteriorating Birch Lake to eutrophication. The Health Department Program turned Birch Lake around. A decrease in phosphorus loadings placed the water in the Oligotrophic range. Lake management specialists suggest that the near million dollar program requires proper septic tank maintenance and the reduction of phosphorus runoff from lawn fertilizers: Pump your tank every one to two years.

If you fertilize, use LAKESIDE available at Reynolds, Russwurm, Temple.

A precise method of describing the productivity of the lake is to use a numerical index which can be calculated directly from water quality data.



I've known Buzz a long time, but we know each other much as weekly riders on the same train come to know each other. We're more than acquaintances, but less than close friends. We're friendly when we find ourselves in the same place at the same time, but our encounters are

almost always organizational or accidental. We like each other, but we're respectful of the limits the other guy needs to put on the relationship.

He's a runner and I'm a runner. That tells us something about each other that non-runners may not know, and it makes us long term members of the same athletic community. We've each been fortunate enough to marry a beautiful, intelligent, full-of-life woman, and we are blessed with wonderful daughters whom we consider "best friends.

Nevertheless, until I saw Buzz's film, "The Four Seasons of Birch Lake," I knew little about who he is in his heart, and I knew almost nothing of his extraordinary talent. What a warm, sensitive, caring, and insightfully observant person he must be, and the proof of that claim can be found woven throughout his marvelous movie

movie.

"The Four Seasons of Birch Lake" is a love poem written by Buzz about this wonderful lake home we all share. It is a portrait of a gorgeous lady painted by her lover and given to others as a tribute to her beauty. If you haven't seen it, you have missed a great experience, and if you don't own it, I believe you risk losing out on something that could forever enrich your life.

This short film parades like a symphony, spinning out its story in melodies so sweet that they make you cry. It is orchestrated with a thorough understanding of craft, and is conducted with wit and emotion. All of this visual music flowed from the same gifted man. Buzz is an artist, and he realizes his artistic vision with his camera.

His selection of locations and subjects and moments to photograph grow from his genius, and his ability to capture radiant color and to freeze inexpressible moments of beauty are awe inspiring. "The Seasons of Birch Lake" is simply a small masterwork, and we are all very lucky to have it.

At the age of nine I knew I wanted to become a writer. I usually express myself far better and more completely through written words than I do through social interaction. I am one with the staff writers of the old New Yorker Magazine, of whom it is said, "they were secretive, and dull and never introduced anyone properly."

That's why art in all of its forms means so much to me, and it is why I knew when I saw Buzz's film that this was a creation that displayed both subject and author to their essence. Buss Rasmussen has opened himself up to all of us, and if you see his marvelous film you can also see right to the center of his soul.
