

The camp across the lake

Camp Tannadoonah was started in the '20s as an all-girl Campfire camp. Since then, boys and non-scouts have been admitted, but the camp hasn't changed much beyond that. Most of the unpowered, wooden cabins have been there since the beginning, and the first "plumbing" facility was bulldozed just recently. The youngest and oldest campers are treated to electricity and in-cabin sinks and toilets, but showers and the rest of the cabins' plumbing is located in a large shower house (boys and girls divided, of course). Many of Tannadoonah's quirky traditions, from re-shutting the door three times after slamming it to digging up a pickle jar full of past campers' experiences, have remained as well.

Campers wake up at Reveille (ever heard that trumpet noise coming from across the lake?), and get ready for breakfast. A few help out in the kitchen while the others attend the

flag-raising ceremony. After breakfast, campers help clean up the camp and go on to their first and second activity periods. Then comes free swim (swim in your level at the waterfront or hang out in the cabins), lunch, and then sing, where counselors teach kids songs they'll sing at the Friday-night campfire. After sing is rest hour, then store, where campers can "buy" two things (candy, pop, and ice cream) with coupon booklets purchased earlier. Campers attend one more activity period and free swim, then head to dinner and flag lowering. After dimner is an all-camp activity, such as Capture the Flag, and everyone gets to bed before Taps plays.

Campers (except for first-timers under 10


Campers (except for first-timers under 10 years of age) can choose whatever they want to do on a daily basis; if you want to take

handicraft one day and archery the next, you can. Each activity (handicraft, archery, sports and games, drama, camperaft, and nature) does something different every day. Only tennis, swimming and boating (sailing, canoeing, kayaking, and rowing) classes must be attended each day.

At the end-of-the week campfire, awards

At the end-of-the week campfire, awards are given out for improving in classes, winning the archery tournament, or just plain attending camp. Five-year campers going into eighth grade (or older), can receive the highest award, the Order of the Birch, for completing certain requirements throughout the week.

From cookouts to campfires, Tannadoonah, though seemingly separate, is an essential part of our Birch Lake culture.



Although hard to really see from the bowl of the lake, Venus dominates the eastern pre-dawn sky as the brilliant "morning star." It rises about two and a half hours before the Sun, and is still fairly low in the east at first light.

Although it's not nearly as bright as Venus, another planet is climbing into view in the mornings — Saturn, the second-largest planet in the solar system. It looks like a bright, pale yellow

star to the lower left of Venus. It's about as bright as nearby Aldebaran, the orange "eye" of Taurus, the bull.

Saturn is one of the most beautiful sights in the entire solar system. Broad, bright rings encircle the planet, so it looks like a cosmic jewel.

Seen through telescopes on Earth, the rings look solid — but they're not. In fact, they're mostly empty space. They're made of

countless small bits of ice and rock. These bits reflect a lot of sunlight. And seen from our great distance away, they appear to blend together to form solid rings around the planet.

Each ring particle orbits
Saturn like a tiny moon. They
may actually have started out as
parts of a BIGGER moon that was
pulled apart by Saturn's gravity.
Today, some SMALL moons
within the ring system act as
shepherds, their gravity keeping




the ring particles in place, so they don't drift away into space or fall toward Saturn.

Look for Saturn beginning about 90 minutes to an hour before sunrise. Over the coming weeks it'll climb farther from the Sun, and will swing past Venus in about two weeks. For now, keep watching and enjoy the show. It's free.

ur property is dissected by Birch Road. Our house sits east of the street, and our lake lot is west. On the south corner of the yard above the road is a set of concrete steps that my wife loves to use as she does her flower tending and my son-in-law would be happy not to have to trim around. The steps lie half on our property and half on the property of the house next door, and this unusual overlapping property improvement occurred because two men who used to live here wanted to build the steps that way.

Noel Bright and Jack Hartranft were great friends. For years they lived side by side and enjoyed each other's company. They did things, neighborly things, that seemed natural and even important in a community like ours, though you would never find such behavior in

towns or cities.

One of their shared projects and acts of declared trust and friendship was to build and use that set of steps that straddled their property lines. Nobody worried about encroachment, or the potential for bickering or the possibility that a future property sale might have some confusing information on the survey or the title insurance policy. In fact, both men liked the steps the way they were and took pride in the manner in which they had been construct-

ed.

It's easy to imagine how the idea might have evolved. Somebody probably got tired of trying to negotiate the steep slope from yard to road, and conversation between the two men, or between their wives, Slyvia and Betty June, could have led to a "let's do it together" kind of decision. That way the project would be easier to accomplish and might involve a laugh or two.

In the years we've been at Birch, I've witnessed many examples of this sort of lake-life neighborliness, and I know it is one of the things that many here treasure about our lives on these shores. It speaks of tolerance, and trust, and a sense of generosity that we find nowhere else outside our families.

All of that may get tested sometime soon if we should become the focus of a governmental sewer project. Diamond Lake now has sewers as does Donnell Lake. Eagle's sewer project is underway, and many believe it is only a matter of time before the sanitary district plan turns toward Birch.

If that happens we will have folks on the

lake who are strongly opposed to getting sewers and others who are just as strongly in favor of the work being done. Some will insist we don't need them and others will complain loudly about the cost, but those who are fearful of water problems or possible property value losses due to pollution will stand up and cheer. Lines will be drawn, petitions may develop and heated discussions will go on up and down these roads.

On other lakes, this issue has led to battles among neighbors that escalated into attacks on property, physical confrontations, violence, and the fracturing of close, long term relationships. I know all of that sounds crazy and unbirchlike, but it has happened again and again to people who thought they had a near-perfect lake community.

If the sewer discussion comes to Birch, please let's all remember Jack Hartranft and Noel Bright and their unusual set of steps. Let's give each other the benefit of trust and tolerance, and let's remember that just like you, the other guy only wants what's best for

Birch.
