

Birch Lake "Wildlife" - MAYFLIES

One of my many childhood memories of Birch Lake is of Mayflies. I remember visiting my Uncle John & Aunt LaVeta at the lake before my parents bought our house on the east side. When we came to visit they would periodically have these bugs hanging on their house, the pier and everywhere in between. It seemed like thousands of bugs to me! You couldn't walk without hearing them crunch, yuck. I thought that Birch Lake must be a very buggy place to live. In 1963 my parents bought the house we now live in and I soon learned that Mayflies inhabited the East Side of Birch Lake as well as the Cove. My parents had bought a home on this "buggy" lake as a retreat!

Whoever heard of a retreating with thousands of bugs? Those Mayflies became a source of fascination for me, they were so delicate and they reminded me of tiny sailboats that sailed on the breezes of Birch Lake. I truly felt sorry for them as they lived such a short life and I was always glad I was not born a Mayfly! The mayfly hatches have dwindled considerably over the years on Birch Lake but we had a considerable hatch a few weeks ago that brought back this memory. So, this week's Wildlife article is all about the Mayfly.

There are approximately 120 Mayfly (Ephemeroptera) species. Most Mayflies have two tails but some three tailed species are present. These tails are visible throughout most of the developmental stages. In the adult the tails are often as long as the body. Mayflies have two large, upright wings, and most have two very small hind wings. Spring Mayflies tend to be dark in color with dark gray wings and dark brown or olive bodies.

Summer Mayflies are lighter in color, most

Summer Mayflies are lighter in color, most likely to blend in with the background and escape their many predators. The wings become pale gray and the body is yellow to pale buff or olive. Then in September and October, emerging flies are darker again.

Mayflies require clean, unpolluted water

that is generally well oxygenated. They are one of the first aquatic species to disappear when water pollution occurs. The use of gasoline motors on our lake and the resulting pollution keeps the Mayfly population on most of our lakes relatively low.

Mayflies live in flowing or still water and occasionally can be found at depths to 200 feet. Life Cycle of the Mayfly: Egg, Nymph, Dun (sub-imago), Spinner (imago), Adult! Adults swarm and mate in flight. In these swarms the male adult will fly up and down (dippers) while the female flies through the swarm. In this pass-through, a male seizes a female and mating takes place. These mating swarms generally occur at dawn or dusk.

swarms generally occur at dawn or dusk.

Eggs are deposited while the female adult is in flight skimming over the water's surface where she will lay as many as 8,000 eggs.

Some species will submerge below the surface to lay their eggs among the vegetation. The egg hatches into an underwater form called a nymph that will develop while hiding on or under the lake bottom vegetation, often burrowing into the mud.

Nymphs feed on algae, and vegetable or organic matter that has settled to the bottom while they grow. The nymphs grow from a very small size through progressively larger stages, each stage is accompanied by a molt.

The insects hatch in the lake sediment, where they can spend up to two years before swimming to the surface and flying to shore. When the nymph is fully grown, it swims to the surface and changes into a winged fly called a dun (sub-imago) by splitting its nymphal skin and emerging from it. They vary greatly in shape, depending on the ecosystem they have become adapted to, such as fast or slow water. The whole process, from the time the mayfly nymph swims to the surface of the lake and the eggs are deposited, takes only 72 hours.

Dun (sub-imago) hatches usually begin around the last half of April. Hatches continue throughout the season right up until the first fall frost. Mayflies may hatch "en masse" in a

few hours or it may take several weeks for the brood to complete a hatch. The dun is not an adult but is fully winged.

The dun often sits on the water with its wings held upright over the back as they dry. Once the dun has dried its wings, it takes flight and lights on nearby trees, buildings, sidewalks and roads. Here at the lake they seem to prefer house screens, decks and piers. They rest for a period of a few hours to a few days while gradually transforming from dun (sub-imago) into adult as they undergo a final molt into a spinner (imago). Spinner (imago) The adult spinner does not feed after this transformation.

They will mate within a few days and then immediately die. The dead or dying adult will then lie on the waters surface with wings spread and, at that point, is referred to as 'spent.'

The mayfly is a water quality indicator. This year the mayflies have alighted along the Pennsylvania shore in record numbers least four times more numerous than two years ago. Ok, so what does that have to do with Birch Lake you're wondering? It appears that as much as we detest the zebra mussels they have been found to be an unlikely benefactor. These rapidly multiplying stripped black and white mollusks filter large amounts of water as they feed on algae and impurities, which allows sunlight to reach deeper depths. Strange as it may sound, the zebra mussels are reported to be cleaning up the water so that we have oxygen in the lower reaches of the lake and it is believed that there is a strong correlation between their arrival and the mayfly's resurgence. These aliens who hitchhiked from southern Russia's Black and Caspian Seas to the Great Lakes in ocean-going ships' ballast in the late 1980's are considered the scourge of the waterways. They are here to stay at Birch Lake but they may be a benefit to the lake in some small way after all.

Take time to enjoy the wildlife Birch Lake has to offer! Respect them so that they will be around for generations to come!

PURPLE LOOSESTRIFE PROJECT

Last year marked the start of the Birch Lake "Purple Loosestrife Project." Nine sites were identified on the shorelines of Birch Lake. All nine sights were cleaned up by

- 1. Identification
- 2. Bagging to prevent the seeds from spreading before the plant is dug out
- 3. Digging the plant out.

This year, so far, one new sight has been identified and one old sight has returned. We need to keep looking for the pinkish-purple flowers. This plant blooms from June through September along the shoreline. Although it has been found on all the shores of Birch Lake, it seems to favor the West Shore where two thirds of the past sightings have been identified. If you see this weed or are not sure, please let us know so we can identify and advise or assist in the proper removal of this weed.

Purple Loosestrife can sprout about a centimeter a day. Mature plants produce between 100,000 to 2-million seeds every year. U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service has dubbed it "PUBLIC ENEMY #1." Purple Loosestrife is an exotic species, therefore has no natural enemies. Sometimes referred to as the "PURPLE PLAGUE." It is a serious problem.

The seeds are believed to have made it to the U.S. in the 1800's via ship ballasts dumped into New York harbor and in imported wool. Helped along by inland waterways, Loosestrife spread to ponds, marshes and river banks. It was an easy invasion. Loosestrife left its natural predators back in Europe. The plant can produce millions of seeds per plant. Loosestrife is among the 12 most wanted "alien species" putting it in the company with zebra mussels and brown snakes.

Purple Loosestrife Sales Are Banned In Michigan

Purple loosestrife is a native of Europe and Asia which has spread throughout much of United States and Canada. As often occurs with exotic species, the plant has no natural enemies. Sometimes referred to as "purple plague," it is a serious problem. Because the flower is so attractive, purple loosestrife has been sold as an ornamental plant. Recently, many states including MICHIGAN have banned its sale.

House Bill #4774 was introduced by Representative James Middaugh on May 5, 1995 and was signed by Governor Engler on October 24, 1995. It became Act #182 Public Acts 1995. The Act amended "THE INSECT PEST AND PLANT DISEASE ACT: Act #189 Public Acts of 1931, and became effective on March 28, 1996. House Bill #4474 would create an act to regulate the planting, cultivation, sale, offering for sale, distribution and transportation of certain non-native plants and to specify penalties for selling Purple Loosestrife.

Act 182 Provisions (Section 16a; paragraph 2, & 4) (2) Except as otherwise provided in this section, in this state, a person shall not sell, offer to sell, or distribute seed from Purple Loosestrife. (4) As of January 1, 1997, retail sales of Purple Loosestrife are not allowed in this state except for cultivers developed and recognized to be sterile and approved by the director of the department of agriculture.



Why do planets change position in the night sky?

If you have not seen the early morning sky in a week or more, you might be caught off guard by Venus' swift motion. Two weeks ago it was near Saturn. Now Venus has past Saturn and is barreling toward Jupiter. Venus will pass 1 degree below Jupiter on August 6. Continue following it through early August and watch Venus close the gap.

Tomorrow and Monday the Moon is near Mars. Sunday it's 9 degrees to the upper right of the Red Planet, and 6 degrees (12 moon diameters) above Antares, in Scorpius. Monday

night the Moon is 7 degrees on the other side of Mars, to the planet's upper left.

So why does it seem that the planets are in a different location in the sky from one night to the next? The planets appear to change position against the fixed" stars in the night sky because of the relative motion of both Earth and the planets as we all move along in our orbits around the Sun. The swift-moving inner planets, Venus and Mercury, can move from morning to evening appearances and back again in as little as a few months. The giant outer planets such as Jupiter or Saturn, with orbits taking decades to complete, appear to move more

slowly against the background of

Most of the time, the planets move EASTWARD through the stars. But for awhile each year, they stop their eastward motion against the background of stars, then turn around and start to move WESTWARD -- a motion known as retrograde.

This change in course baffled astronomers for millennia. But in the 1500s, Nicolaus Copernicus suggested that the retrograde riddle could be solved by assuming that Earth and all the other planets revolve around - a blasphemous notion (much like IST) that gave birth to modern astronomy. The planets themselves are still moving



forward in their orbits our perspective changes. Earth is closer to the Sun than Mars, Jupiter and Saturn, so we move faster. As we overtake and pass these planets, they appear to move backward — just as a car you overtake on the highway appears to move backward against the background of buildings and trees for awhile.

Next week, the Subaru logo and a horrifying thought. Until then, try to coerce yourself into rising early enough to keep track of Venus and Jupiter. The show never stops, so enjoy. It's free.
