TURBULENT WATERS

The calm and peace of Birch lake has for the last week been disrupted by the inconsideration of some valutioners bent on having a good time at the expense of swimmers and fishermen. For the last week fishing and swimming have been nearly impossible because of the commotion and waves made by these two large boats. Their disregard of safety sense has caused the mothers of the South-side to keep their children out of the water for the entire week.

Rhyner Scholma, our well known and well liked conservation creel census clerk, approached these men with a suggestion that they drive their boats more carefully, as his own boat had almost been swamped a few minutes before. He was set upon by one of the men and nearly dragged from his boat into the lake. Witnesses saw his aged Nother, 73 years old, knocked to the bottom of the boat. Cottagers started to Rhyner's aid but by the time they reached the sene he had control of the situation. Many complaints have been made by people all around Birch Lake concerning the recklessness of these individuals. Steps have been taken to bring this incident before the proper authorities.

We only hope this will serve as a lesson and reminder to anyone who in the future disregards the safety and pleasure of other cottagers of the lake.
