

Any motor woat, launch, or other water craft.....operated on the inland waters of this state.....shall be aquipped with a stock factory muffler, underwater exhaust or other modern or improved device capable of adequately muffling the sound of the exhaust of the engine; and such muffler shall be kept and remain closed.... at all times when such engine or engines are in operation......No such motor boat shall be operated on any of said waters in a reckless manner or at an excessive rate of speed so as to endange the live or property of any person in or on said waters, having due regard to the presence of other boats, bathers, persons engaged in fishing..... and no person shall operate such motor boat on said waters at a rate of speed greater than will permit him to bring it to a stop within the assured clear distance ahead.

Sec. 2
Any such motor boat operated on said waters during the period from one hour after sunset to one hour before sunrise shall be equipped with a light on the bow (front) which can be plainly distinguished at a distance of 500 fect.

Sec. 3

Any officer duly authorized to make arrests, including any officers of the department of conservation, may and it shall be his duty to arrest without warrant any person violating any provisions of this act in his presence.




