


OUR ANNUAL BOAT PARADE WILL BE HELD ON SUNDAY - JULY 25th - at 3:00 P. M.

ATTENTION: ALL BOATERS

Carl Witte, officer for the Cass County Sheriff's Department and in charge of Marine Patrol on all lakes in Cass County gives you the following points to remember:

- 1. KEEP TO THE RIGHT and travel around the lake in a counter-clockwise direction.
- 2. Keep 100 FEET away from piers, swimming areas and anchored objects (this includes fishing boats)
- 3. When you obey these rules you are acting in accordance with the laws of the State of Michigan.

Does your Boating Equipment include

- 1. Registration on Boat (M C 1234 AB)
- 2. Registration Certificate in boat while boat is in operation.
- 3. Fire Extinguisher
- 4. Paddles
- Coast Guard approved cushions or life preservers (one for each passenger)
- 6. Plastic Pail or other means of bailing (this is not required by law but could come in mighty handy)


