



MICHIGAN'S SAFE BOATING SCHOOL

To effectively combat a rising water accident rate, Michigan's Water Safety Advisory Council offered boating groups and industry spring and summer safe boating courses. Developed by Michigan's Boating Control Committee, a council member, the courses covered state boating laws, water safety rules and life saving techniques. The Michigan Marine Dealers Association, also a member of the Water Safety Council, directed safety efforts at the commercial level. Member dealers, according to Association Executive Secretary Frank E. Burch, for example, discouraged buyers from selecting motors too large for their boats. Safety Council Membership included the U. S. Coast Guard, Scouts, Power Squadrons, Red Cross, State Police and the Michigan Sheriffs Association.
