TO ACQUAINT YOU WITH THE MICHIGAN TRAFFIC LAWS FOR BOATS

Persons operating vessels on the waters of this state in areas not marked by well defined channels, canals, rivers or stream courses, shall operate in a COUNTER-CLOCKWISE fashion insefar as it is reasonably possible. Such persons shall maintain a distance of ONE HUNDRED FEET from any dock, raft, buoyed or occupied bathing area, or vessel moored or at anchor, except when pre-

ceeding at a "slew ne-wake" speed and except when engaged in picking up or dropping eff water skiers, so long as such operation is otherwise conducted with due regard to the safety of persons and property and in


accordance with the laws of this state.

From Richard Johnson, our Marine Deputy on Birch Lake, Cass County, Mich:

This is the Michigan Law Relating to Registration of Motorbeats

All Michigan certificates of meterbeat registration expired as of last December 31, 1965. All meterbeats operating on Michigan waters must have valid registrations from the State of Michigan or be registered in accordance with a federally approved registration and numbering system of another state.
