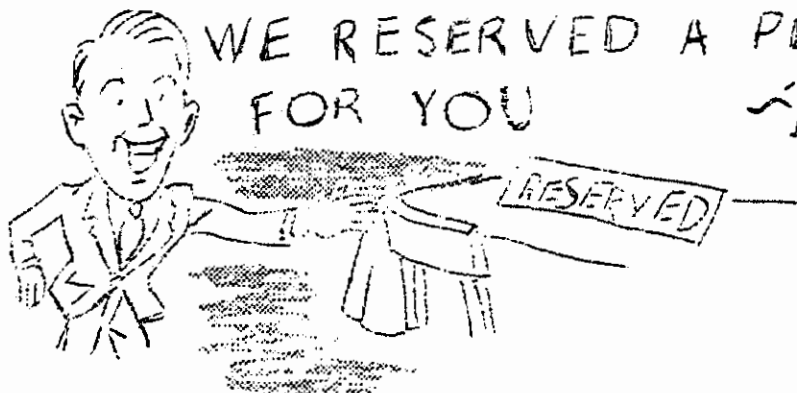

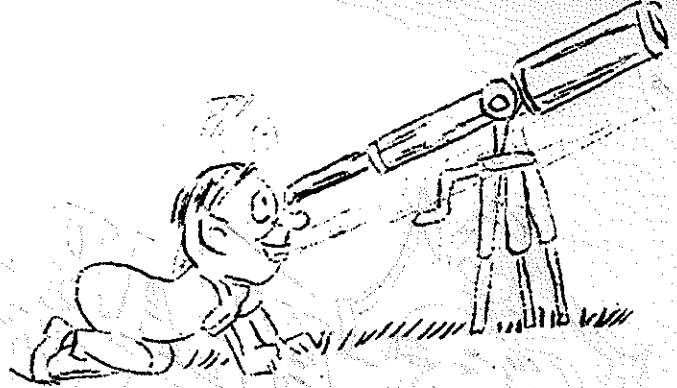
Vincent Stare of Chicago spent a few days with the S. Dixon's on East Hill.
