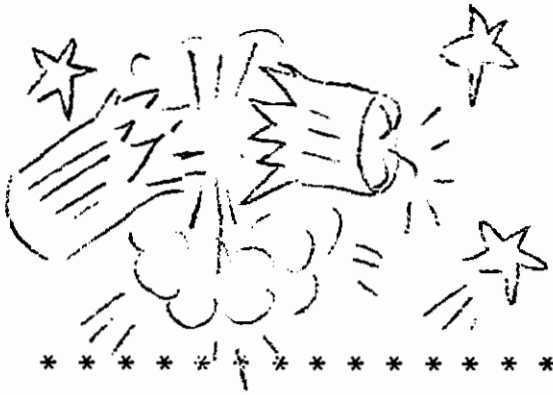

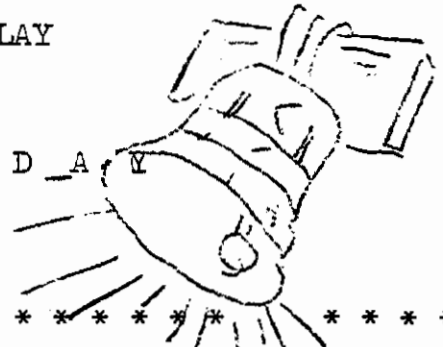

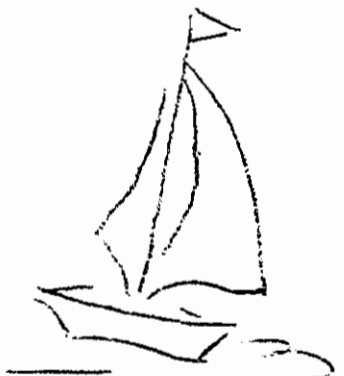

May 30 - 1968

Meeting was called to order by Commodore Fulmer at 11: A.M., Mich.time.

Present were I. T. Bowers, Lester Meyers, LaMar King, Pat Forbes, Herbert Howard, Mahlon Eberhart and Richard Cowen.

Minutes August 26, 1967 were read and approved.

William Biler was appointed director for north side to fill the vacancy caused by the passing away of Paul Thayer.

The standing Committee's reports were as follows:

I. T. Bowers reported arrangements have been completed and partial payment made for fireworks on the evening of July 3rd or in case of rain on July 4th.

LaMar King and Dick Cowen of the Annual Dinner Committee reported that arrangements have been made for the dinner to be held on August 17th.

The Boat Parade is scheduled for August 11th.

The new directory will soon be ready for distribution.

The Seven State Regatta was discussed.

The purchasing of a record player was discussed and postponed for a later date.

It was decided to hold next meeting June 15 at 11:00 A.M., Mich. Time. The meeting was then adjourned.....LaMar King, Acting Sec. R.E.F.

June 15th, 1968

Meeting called to order at 10:15 Michigan Time. Present were Fulmer, H. Howard, I. T. Bowers, Pat Forbes, M. G. Eberhart, Garry Stout and Marine Patrol Officer Ted Peak.

Minutes of last meeting read and approved. Moved by Stout, seconded by Howard that all monies be turned into the Treasurer.

Our new deputy Ted Peak, who is a science teacher at Edwardsburg High School, explained some of the new Michigan Boating regulations.

It was voted that a note be put in the Birch Barker that all persons who have not paid their boat storage should make remittance to the Treasurer, a director or other officer.

It was decided that the new 1968 Birch Lake Directories be distributed to the various directors along with membership cards to be presented to members upon payment of membership dues and contribution to fireworks.

It was reported that a conference was held with township supervisor Norman Harvey and that Harvey Street will be black-topped this summer from Robbins Lake road to a point north of the entrance to Camp Tannadoonah and will be graded from that point on to Walnut Road then south on Walnut to Brownsville St. - this portion to be black-topped in 1969. The meeting was then adjourned.

PLEASURE BOATING SAFETY COURSE

will be available June 26th, 27th and 28th at 10:00 A.M. Michigan Time at the Birch Lake Yacht Clubhouse. It will be given by Marine Patrol Officer, Ted Peak, who is assigned to Birch, Shavehead and Donnel Lakes. Since the new Michigan State Law requires a Certificate of Completion of this course for persons sixteen years or younger to operate a motor boat, you are urged to take advantage of this opportunity.

THE NEW 1968 MICHIGAN BOATING REGULATIONS are as follows;

NUMBERING: ALL MOTORBOATS used on Michigan waters must be numbered for identification and a valid Certificate of Number must be on board the motorboat whenever it is in use. Motorboats which are principally used in this State must have Michigan numbers. Visitors from other states temporarily using Michigan waters may retain their home state numbers for a period of 90 consecutive days -- if they remain longer the boat must be re-numbered in Michigan.

REQUIRED EQUIPMENT: LIFE SAVING DEVICES. Every vessel being operated on Michigan waters must provide one of the following Coast Guard Approved Life saving devices for each person on board: Life Preserver...Life Vest...Ring Buoy...and Buoyant Cushion all to be Coast Guard Approved.

FIRE EXTINGUISHERS: Motorboats of closed or semi-closed construction are subject to fire and explosion. For this reason these motorboats must carry Coast Guard Approved fire extinguishing equipment.

NAVIGATION LIGHTS: All motorboats operated between sunset and sunrise must be equipped with and display navigation lights as follows: All Motorboats of less than 11 H.P. - 1 white light either flashlight or lantern exhibited in time to prevent collision. Motorboats less than 26 feet in length powered by 11 or more H.P. - 1 white light aft visible 2 miles, 1 combination light forward, green to starboard and red to port visible 1 mile.

MUFFLERS: Every motorboat operated on Michigan waters must have a stock factory muffler, underwater exhaust or other device capable of adequately muffling the sound of the engine's exhaust. This means that the engine's exhaust shall be so suppressed as to not create "excessive or unusual" noise.

WATER SKIING RESTRICTIONS: The sport of water skiing is exhilarating to all who have successfully accomplished the skills necessary to successful skiing. To be certain that it is as safe as it is exciting, Michigan law imposes two basic requirements on the sport. (1) No one shall water ski from 1 hour after sunset until one hour before sunrise, and (2) No one shall operate a water ski tow boat unless it is equipped with a 170 degree wide angle rear view mirror and has a competent observer on board.

REAR VIEW MIRRORS: All motorboats towing water skiers must be equipped with a rear view mirror which will cover a 170 degree arc astern. The mirror must be so located as to provide the towboat operator with a clear view of the skier(s) towed. Ski tow boats must also have on board at least one competent person so located as to be in a position to observe the water skier(s). This requirement permits the boat operator to concentrate on maneuvering the towboat and to keep an alert lookout ahead while the observer keeps him apprised of the skier's progress. The observer can also assist in recovering a fallen skier and retrieving the tow rope.

COUNTER-CLOCKWISE OPERATION: When you are operating on open water you should direct your vessel in a counter-clockwise direction. When all boats are moving in the same direction the dangers of "meeting" or "head-on" situations are eliminated.

OPERATING A VESSEL WHEN INTOXICATED OR UNDER THE INFLUENCE OF DRUGS IS PROHIBITED: Serious accidents can, and do, result when a vessel operator does not have control of his faculties as a result of immoderate use of alcohol. Narcotic drugs, barbitals and other drugs can also reduce the competence of a vessel's operator to a dangerous degree. Michigan law therefore prohibits operation or control of a vessel by a person under the influence of alcohol, narcotic, drugs or barbitol, or by habitual users of narcotic drugs or barbitals. The law also prohibits a vessel owner from allowing his craft to be operated by those persons noted above.

RECKLESS OPERATION: The reckless operator of a vessel seriously endangers all water users--including himself. This is the person we neither need nor want on our waters and for that reason he can be ruled off the water for up to two years! Too many persons do not recognize the seriousness of this offense. This is the law!

"Sec. 74. A person who operates any vessel, upon any of the waters of this state, carelessly and heedlessly in disregard of the rights or safety of others, or without due caution and circumspection and at a speed or in a manner so as to endanger or be likely to endanger any person or property, is guilty of reckless operation of a vessel and shall be punished as provided in section 166."

YOUTHFUL BOAT OPERATORS: No one wants to prevent young folks from having a good time afloat. But for their own protection, safety and good fun, as well as to assure the safety of other water users, limited restrictions have been imposed on certain age groups. The restrictions are as follows:

- Under 12 years of age: (1) May operate a vessel alone except those powered by 6 or more horsepower.
- (2) May operate a vessel powered by a 6 or more horsepower motor only when accompanied by a person 16 years of age or older.
- 12 - 16 years of age: (1) May operate a vessel alone except those powered by 6 or more horsepower.
- (2) May operate a vessel powered by a 6 or more horsepower motor only when accompanied by a person 16 years of age or older or when in possession of a Boating Safety Certificate.

Boating Safety Certificates are issued to youths in the 12-16 year age group who have successfully completed a Department-Approved course in boating safety. For further information on boating safety courses contact the Boat and Water Safety Section, Department of Conservation, Lansing, Michigan 48926, your local sheriff department, American Red Cross Chapter, U. S. Coast Guard Auxiliary Flotilla or U. S. Power Squadron.

PERSONS WHO HAVE NOT PAID THEIR BOAT STORAGE SHOULD MAKE REMITTANCE TO MAELON EBERHART, TREASURER, A DIRECTOR OR OTHER OFFICER. BLYC REGULATIONS STATE THAT FEE IS TO BE PAID BEFORE BOAT IS REMOVED FROM STORAGE.

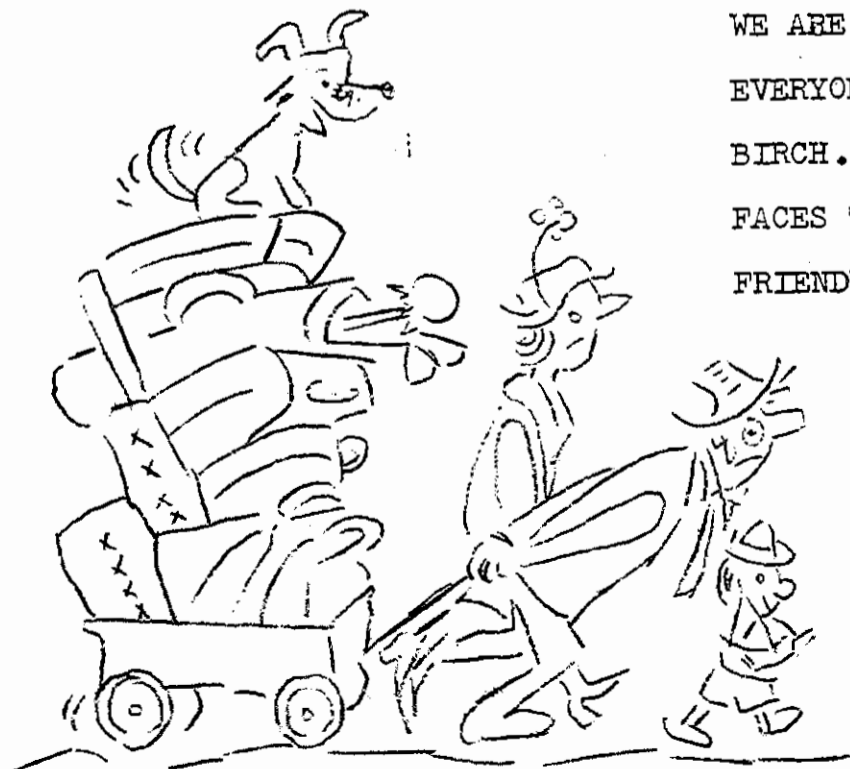
