ARTIFICIAL RESPIRATION

START IMMEDIATELY - SECONDS COUNT

- LAY THE PERSON ON HIS BACK turn his head to the side. (1)out his mouth and make sure his tongue is not back in his throat. Then straighten his head...put your hand under his neck, lift up.
- (2)RAISE JAW - pull the chin up until the head is tilted back fully. This is absolutely essential for keeping the air passage straight and open
- (3) PROVIDE AIR - put your mouth tightly over his. Pinch his harmy nostrils shut. Now exhale. Hard enough to make his chest rise.
- Remove your mouth. If you don't hear the sound of returning air, check head position. Breathe again. If you still don't hear anything, turn him on his side and slap between shoulders to dis-(4) lodge foreign matter. Repeat breathing, removing your mouth each time so the air can escape.

For babies and very young children cover both nose and mouth tightly with your mouth. Take relative short breaths, about 20 a minute. For adults, breathe vigorously about 12 times a min.

(5) REPEAT BLOWING CYCLE. DON'T GIVE UP Don't stop until he starts breathing himself or until a doctor gets there. Practise these steps with your child. First let him be the victim. Then let him "save you".

SOME IMPORTANT ADVICE

Never leave a small child alone in any kind of water. Not even for a few seconds. He pan drown in just two inches. And he doesn't realize the danger.

By the time a child is three or four he should have swimming lessons from a qualified person. And should know these water safety rules: DON'T SWIM ALONE at unsupervised beaches or pools, including small backyard pools. DON'T JOKINGLY CALL FOR HELP in the water. DON'T PANIC OR THRASH ABOUT when you get a cramp. SAVE YOUR ENERGY. Float till help arrives.
