P.S. And we will be happy to hand over the Editor's job to the very first critic and "for free" too!!




Pot Paeve - Those wild grape vines entwine and pull down plants, trees and shrubs. Cutting them back annually will keep them under control.




If the Mankel engine takes over perhaps the day of oil-spraying cutbourds will be over - with a return to cleaner waters.
