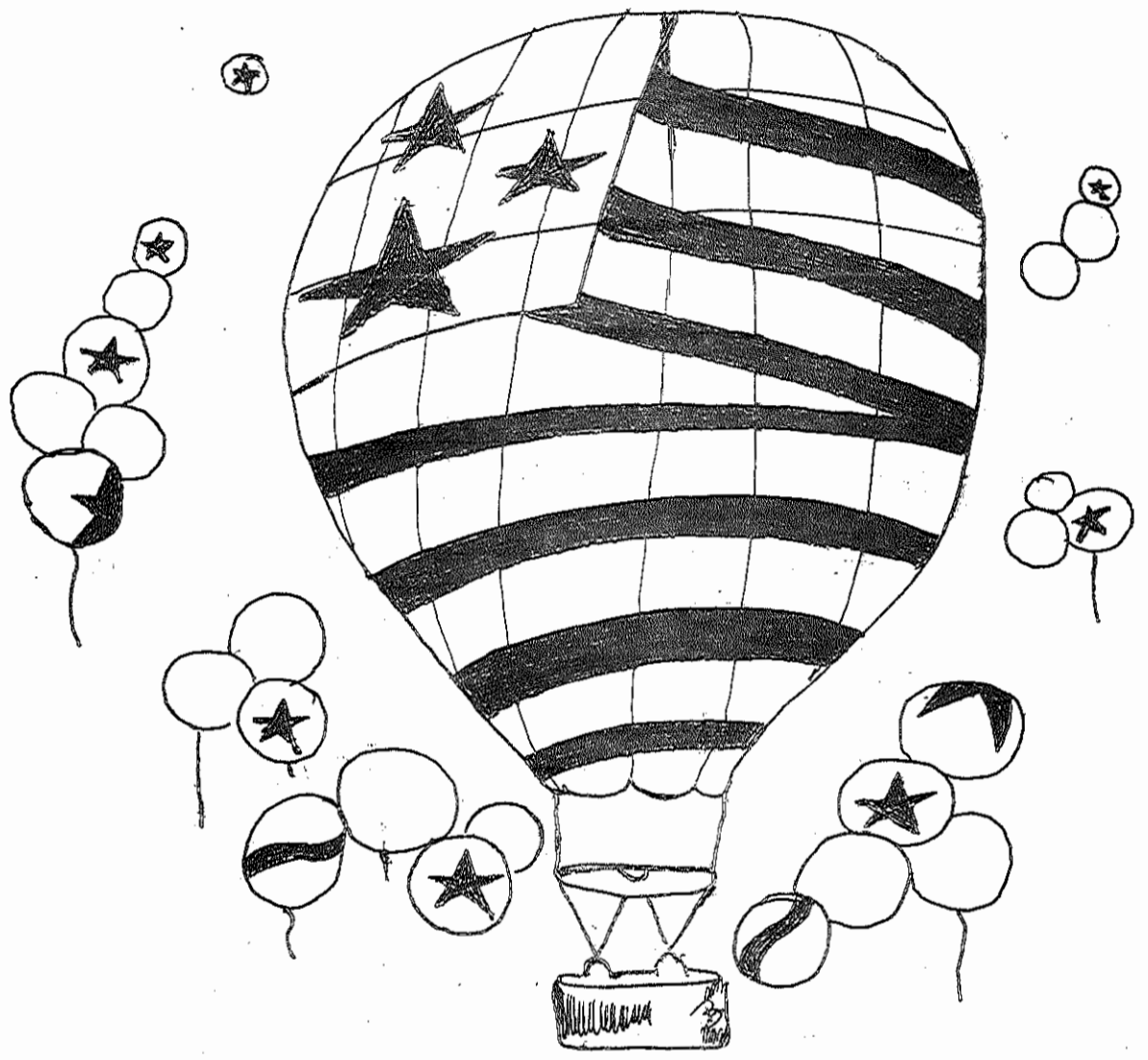

Several people from around the lake have voiced an interest in controlling pollution as much as we can here in Michigan and more specifically - Birch Lake. The following items were presented for use in the BARKER. The first list of suggestions is as follows:

"As we get into the business of running the summer home or cottage for the '72 season there are a few environmental hints that would help us remember you more warmly over the next winter.

1. DON'T BURN YOUR GARBAGE! There are two collectors who work this area of Michigan - one out of Cass and one in Williamsville.
2. WRAP or put in cans ALL TRASH AND GARBAGE.
3. Cut brush as small as possible.
4. Remember that in today's world a smoky fire left to smolder most of the day only adds to the already polluted atmosphere. (The odor may be offensive too.)

There are many children and adults with breathing disorders and polluted air irritates to the point that breathing becomes difficult."

THE BURNING PROBLEM

Some people around the lake burn paper and trash in oil drums or non-ventilated containers. These methods cause undue smoke and smoldering. (POLLUTION!) When burning in open wire containers, the ash and sparks blow around.

The hazards in burning by the above methods are:

1. You can cause a fire on your property or your neighbors'.
2. The smoking and smoldering cause annoyance to you and your neighbors.
3. The flying ash causes a cleaning problem to you and your neighbors. Sometimes it lands on a clean wash on the line.

In order to make it cleaner and more pleasant around the lake and in order to eliminate some of these nuisances, your "HEALTH AND SAFETY COMMITTEE" recommends:

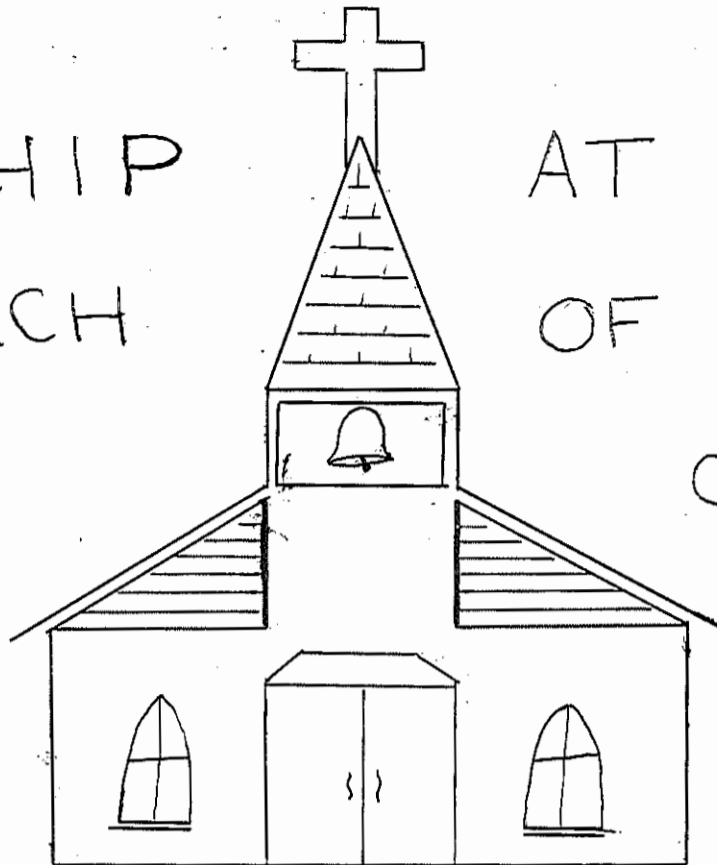
1. That you burn in the enclosed type of burners, which are ventilated and provide oxygen for your fire to burn with less smoke and no sparks. This type burner generally has a grate and an ash pan. If you can't afford this type now, buy one when you need a new one.
2. Confine your burning to a time when the wind blows away from the lake, thereby blowing the smoke away from you and your neighbors.
3. Do not burn on very windy days in order to prevent possible fires to buildings and grass and shrubbery.
4. If it is necessary to burn brush or leaves (open fires) you should attend your fire at all times.
5. Some property owners who have the commercial garbage service put all their burnables in plastic bags and the garbage man takes them. This is a good way to prevent pollution!
