

#### POLLUTION

A lady on the East side of the lake recently wrote an article in the BIRCH BARKER about soap suds, wash water and an odor on the lake.

First the suds: Many complaints have been made over the years about soap suds, especially on Mondays. Many of these complaints came from residents on the East side. Several people have tried to find the source but without success. Last year one of our directors took on the responsibility of surveying the East shore for pipelines to the lake, along the shoreline. Nothing specific was reported. A man on the South side of the lake collected a sample bottle of sudsy water and sent it to Lansing for analysis. He has not yet had an answer. Any resident can get a sterilized bottle from the Health Department and send a water sample to Lansing for analysis at no cost. The director of Camp Tannadoonah sends samples of the lake water to the state periodically. As far as we know there has not been a bad report. The Health Department said they will take another water sample at the outlet soon. Some residents feel that this sudsing is caused by waves on the water and is natural . . . . but who can be sure?

Secondly - Septic tanks and dry wells: There have been suspicions that sewage water has been seeping into our lake at different times. The Health Department recently reported that two cottages had to install dry wells on the back side of the road because of faulty drainage, or drainage too close to the lake shore. There is another cottage which had a septic system which was not approved by the county. They are requiring the owner to change the system before it will be approved. We know of one Michigan lake community (Houghton) which had to install a public sewage system. It appears that this is a coming requirement for lake communities.

Thirdly - Scum: We all know there is some scum accumulating on the water and along the shores. Probably most of this is unburned oil from outboard motors, because it is more noticeable on Sundays and Mondays, after and during heavy usage by boats. The more time the outboards spend on the lake, the more we can expect scum. This pollution could be a serious problem in the future and could contribute to a bad condition to our lake. This condition is helped by the smaller amount of oil used in newer motors.

Summary: There are laws which are designed to prohibit or control all pollution in the air and water. Every resident should be conscientious about what goes into our lake, including solid waste such as paper, cans, cardboard containers, cigarette butts, etc., as well as septic tank waste and wash water. Most of our complaints are not specific enough to take action. We need to know what cottage or person is polluting the lake before legal action can be taken. We cannot just accuse. It is a healthy condition to complain, especially about pollution and our ecology. However, we do encourage you to be more specific. Complaints should be made as the lady did, and everyone should complain about things which affect our lake and environment so that they can be improved. It is everybody's job!






