POLLUTION

In an article in the BIRCH BARKER of July 29, the Health and Safety Committee said that the Health Department reported that two cottages had to install dry wells on the back side of the road. We wrote that the reason was faulty drainage or drainage too close to the lake shore. A man and wife came to see me on Sunday, because they interpreted the article as saying that they had faulty drainage, etc., because their cottage was one of the two which had a new dry well put on the other side of the road. They reported that their old dry well was so saturated with roots that it did not function and it was 40' from the lake. We did not know who the owners were who put in new dry wells. All we knew was that the Health Department said that there were two cottages which put in new dry wells. We did not intend to point a finger at, or insinuate, that these two cottages were polluting the lake. We congratulate these people who built new dry wells according to the County's new regulations, which are as follows for a new dry well or septic tank: New dry wells or septic tanks must be 50' from the lake - 50' from any water well - 25' from a basement foundation - and 10' from any property line. No existing dry wells can be re-worked without a permit. (These figures were verified by the Health Department.)
