Harrison repeated his former tatements that in May both saniary and detergent surveys showed he Birch Lake water quality to be ine. He admitted, though, with 2 lakes to study, he could not et dates when Birch Lake would be estudied.

The Lake Self-Help program was xplained and our Association was uthorized to conduct such a proram that will augment the survey he department will undertake. he Self-Help program will consist two phases: one, another bot-le sample analysis; the other, pluntary dye-testing of septic vstems. The water samples have en taken and forwarded to Grand pids for analysis. Information e located, the Department of alth will take effective action > remedy these situations.

Further, the suspicious water ality readings at the public ach were discussed. It was made undantly clear that we desired tion at this area with at least e installation of rest room .e cilities. Harrison advised that is was not a County issue but at it should be directed to the pt. of Natural Resources. Our rong recommendations on this sue will be sent to the DNR at ice.

Our little samples have been sent to Grand Rapids for bacteriological analysis. The results will be sent back to the Cass Co. Dept. of Health. Lastly, leak tracer dye has been ordered and this testing program is being formulated.

The meeting proved to be both informative and somewhat alarming and produced a lively question and answer session. That any part of Birch Lake water could be of suspicious quality is not what we want to hear. (uality problems just can't happen here, many are heard to say. Our great body of deep, spring-fed water just can't get to a dangerous level of harmful bacteria.

That may be true; well, many well intentioned people said the same things about a deeper, larger, and sparkling Lake Tahoe and it did happen there. We have been served with some warnings. It's going to be up to us to see that Birch Lake water quality is kept at the highest level possible as dyd-testing will be forthcoming. we cooperate with the Cass County suspicious sources of bacteria Dept. of Health survey,
