As a member of the Park Commission, he assured us that the Commission would give consideration to our problem.

But we had better all sit down and take a look at the whole picture, before the lake is contaminated beyond use--fishing, swimming or any use at all.

Before anyone chooses sides and draws even a verbal bead on his or her Birch Lake neighbor, we had better realize that there are some steps we can take, as a concerned community to straighten things out before they get worse.
