Beautiful Birch Lake lies at the head of the Matador Valley. The valley can best be enjoyed by a drive down Pine Tree Road. This is one of the many scenic drives around here. If you have not taken it you have missed on of the most beautiful sections of Southern Michigan. This road runs along the stately pines, through wooded sections to the hill overlooking Snake Creek. Stop at the top of the hill and enjoy this enchanting view. The willow and chestnut trees are a vived contrast to the maples and beeches high in the hills.
