SAILING CHALLENGE FROM AME ALCORT

AMF Alcort and the President's Council on Physical Fitness and Sports are pleased to announce the Presidential Sports Award for sailing. This new program will help to focus attention on sailing as a sport that more and more Americans should experience for sheer enjoyment. and health benefits.

To become eligible for this award one must sail a minimum of fifty (50) hours (no more than 2 1/2 hours per day may be credited to the total) and record the information on an official entry log. Sailors successfully completing the requirements are eligible to receive an official emblem patch, pin and certificate signed by the President.
