

lc. whole wheat flour

1/4c. soy flour

1/3 c. rolled oats

3/4 c. unsweetned coconut

1/4 c. milk powder

1/2 t. salt

1/4 c. molasses

1/4 c. honey

1/2 t. powdered ginger

2/3 c. raisins

2/3 c. chocolate chips

1/4 c. chopped peanuts

1/4 c. sunflower seeds

1/4 c. oil or melted butter

1/4 c. molasses

1/4 c. honey

2 eggs, beaten

Stir together all of the dry ingredients. Beat the eggs in a small bowl, measure the oil, honey and molasses in the same measuring cup. Beat all the liquid ingredients together throughly. Pour the liquid into the dry ingredients and combine until the dry ingredients are moistened. If mixture seems a little dry add some milk or water. Bake at 350° for 10 minutes.
