Elliott and Jim Muldoon of the Planning Commission as well as Dr. Gerald Snow, a biologist with Andrew University, presented an excellent seminar. They informed those present of the problems that exist or which could develope on Birch Lake. Suggestions were made by them as to what we, as residents can do to improve the quality of our water. A water sample was made earlier in the spring which showed Birch Lake to be a relatively clean lake with one exception. The phosphorus level is a bit high. They are planning more tests throughout the summer. There will be future articles in the Barker concerning this matter and information pertaining to ways that we as residents can keep Birch Lake a clean, safe lake.
