COMMODORES COMMENTS

Our Board Meeting was attended by 16 members and a great many areas were discussed. Highlights were that the boat parade will be returned to the 4th of July weekend and that the possibility of having fireworks again is being looked into. The Directory, being a large undertaking, is now planned to be ready for distribution by the Spring Dinner in "83". Boat storage is now being accepted. Chuck Fortino, Dave Anthony, and Bill King all former Commodores are the nominating committee. They would appreciate any input you may have. Ways of revenue producing for basically Yacht Club maintenance were discussed. The possibility of holding a non denominational Church Service at the Yacht Club. These and other items will be looked into and reported on at the Dinner.


1. The Couples Race will be run this afternoon, Saturday August 14th at 3:00 PM (Indiana Time). Awards will be made at the Annual Dinner.

WATER SAFETY

Once again we want to stress water safety. Sunday evening there was an accident on the lake. Our emergency units responded promptly and expertly. Have your emergency number handy.

There has been some abuse and misunderstanding of law about where a boat may travel. The law is as copied from the Michigan Pleasure Boating Book by the Law Enforcement Division of the Michigan Department of Natural Resources.

"SLOW NO-WAKE SPEED"

All motor boats and vessels must limit speed to a slow no-wake speed when within 100 ft.of: a. rafts, except for ski jumps and ski landing floats

b. docks

c. launching ramps

d. swimmers

anchored, moored or drifting boats e.

This means a speed slow enough that the wake or wash of the boat creates a minimum disturbance. It applies on all water except for zoned ski areas and authorized ski return areas. Buoys and signs marked "SLOW NO-WAKE" mean operation at slow minimum and swell height speed.

Common Courtesy, Common Sense, and Caution should be practiced at all times.
