Due to the short week and press of business all news may not get in the Barker this week. We will get it next week.



Camp Tannadoonah has opened its 53rd season on Birch Lake. We have a record number of campers attending this summer so we are alive and well and have no intention of closing or selling.

For the past 13 years we have tried very hard to have good relationships with the people on the lake. We have always welcomed our neighbors on a stroll thru camp; have offered the use of our Dining Hall and camp — at no charge — for the Birch Lake Yacht Club Banquet at the end of the season; and have had our campers serenade the people on the lake at least twice each summer. We have felt good rapport with our neighbors and most of you have been very good neighbors and very understanding of our problems. In spite of this, lately we have been criticized for things we do and we have heard things said that we feel are unfair and unjust. We realize it is very easy to point a finger at that "girl scout" camp" (incidentally, we are owned and operated by the Michiana Council of Camp Fire in South Bend) if something happens since we are probably the largest resident on the lake. Who else has a family of 120! As one of the larger land owners, it seems inconsistent that we have never been asked to represent the camp views by the Yacht Club or any other decision making body of Birch Lake. We feel badly about all of these misunderstandings as we enjoy being here and fully support the other residents. We also probably pay five times more taxes to the State of Michigan than anyone else.

There are several things that have been stated about the camp that we feel should be clarified:

l. It was brought to our attention that at some point this winter or spring someone from the lake who was walking thru camp before it was open (and yes, it is private property) complained at a social function how run-down and shabby the camp looked. How does any place look after being uninhabited for seven months?? After opening this spring, we have painted nearly 3/4 of the buildings, repaired the steps, groomed the grounds, etc. We would like to have these same people return and tour the camp again.

2. It has been said the place is a real mess since the trees were cut. Yes, we realized it would be a mess but the woods had never been cleared and the Conservation Dept. recommended we do so. It has given the camp more light with less chance for the buildings to rot; has given the small seedlings a chance to grow; and has given our neighbors a lot of wood to burn. In three or four years it will have all grown back. The worst appears to be along the road to the waterfront, which incidentally is a private road and invisible to most residents unless they are walking thru.
3. We are working with the State of Michigan on a project to

correct the erosion problem and filling in of the ravine where the cabin collapsed. This will take a couple of years to complete. We do not appreciate lake kids sneaking into camp at night trying to scare our younger campers, cutting our buoy lines, and cutting ropes to set our boats adrift. Nor do we appreciate the many acts of vandalism that occur here and we will complain and take action on these.

We do NOT complain about the noise from parties in the wee hours; people using our waterfront (even though we must legally prohibit this); joggers using our property as part of their course; our tennis court being used without permission or people walking thru camp on a leisurely stroll. And we do not plan to start complaining now.

We only wish that you would be as non-critical of us.


