

CONSERVED BOARD SHOWS REPORT

Often times at the lake we run out of a certain good product needed to make dinner or such; here are some common cooking substitutions:

- * Out of cheddar cheese? use mild cheese & add some dry mustard, hot pepper sauce & worcestershire sauce.
- No sour cream? Mix in a blender 1 cup cottage cheese, 2 TBL milk & 1 tsp lemon juice.
- * No semi-sweet chocolate? for each 1 oz square, use 3 TBL unsweetened cocoa, 1 TBL shortening or butter and 1 TBL Sugar.
- * No whipping cream? Beat together 1/2 cup each ice water &instant nonfat dry milk powder until soft peaks form. Add 1 TBL lemon juice & beat until soft peaks form. Add 1/3 cup powdered sugar. Serve immediately or refrigerate & beat with a wire whisk just before serving. Makes 2 1/2 cups.
- In most salads & salad dressings sour cream may be replaced by yogurt, half-and-half, whipped cream, mayonnaise or a combination of the above.

Nowdays everyone seems to need some money-saving ideas to help with the budget. Here are a few to help you along! aperigidades procesos

- Shop early in the morning for half-price markdown on produce & bread.
- A food processor does a good job of grinding & chopping raw & leftover cooked meat.
- * Instead of beef flank, use top round; tenderize & broil or grill; slice across the grain for London Broil.
- Make popsicles using fruit in ice cube trays with sticks or straws.
- * Buy cheese in a solid piece rather than sliced or grated.
- Slice your own lunchmeat.
- Substitute carrots, fruits, raisins, and juice for cookies, pretzels, chips & soda pop as snacks. They're easier on your budget & have fewer calories too!

Lemon Butter Snowballs - Crust: 1/2 c. butter softened, 1 1/3 c. flour; 1/4 c. sugar Filling: 2 eggs; 3/4 c. sugar; 2 TBL flour; 1/4 tsp baking powder; 3 TBL lemon juice; Topping: Confectioner's Sugar. Mix crust ingredients. Pat into 8" ungreased pan. Bake at 350 degrees for 15 min. Pour filling over crust, return to oven. Bake 20 min. more or until set. Sprinkle with confection sugar. Cut when cool.

AVOIDING THE ITCH

Here are a few ways to reduce the chances of getting swimmers! itch: Bathers should dry off with a towel immediately after leaving the water

If Swimmers' itch has been a problem in an particular area, avoid swimming there immediately after an onshore wind

Since the parasites are carried across water by westerly winds, avoid swimming on the eastern and southern shores.

Those who end up getting swimmers itch can reduce the discomfort by taking drugs that contain anti-histamines. Topical steroid creams to apply to the affected areas are available over the counter and will relieve itching.
