Even tho it has been publicized in newspapers and in the tax notices, there are many taxpayers that do not know about the ordinance or they choose to ignore it.

In any event, it is a reality, and must be considered as an effective document and it is being enforced. Zoning involves all structures (dwellings, accessory bldgs., decks, etc. and land use) The ordinance reads: "No structure, building, or land shall be erected, moved, reconstructed,

"No structure, building, or land shall be erected, moved, reconstructed, extended, or altered except in conformity with the regulations as set forth in document." There is a complete (32 page) ordinance available for all to read at the township hall. The procedure for you to follow"

The BLT is coming. Are you ready? The Birch Lake Triathlon will be Sat. Aug. 4 at 8:30 A.M. It will consist of a $\frac{1}{4}$ mile swim, $7\frac{1}{2}$ mile bike, and a 3 mile run. Lake residents and their families may enter. Entries will be as an individual or as a team. This event is open to all ages. We encourage parents of children entering to volenteer. Many volenteers will be needed to help, this will be a good way to watch the race and be a part of it too. Questions can be answered by Bill Carpenter or Dan Reynolds.

The swim will start at Welch's cottage and go to Carpenter's. The area will be inside the rafts so water depth will not be a problem. Boats will be in the area for assistance if needed. Bikes will be along the road behind Carpenter's. The ride will go to the public beach, then up the hill following Birch Rd. to Shavehead Rd. Down Shavehead to Robbins Lake Rd, which will be the turn around point. The ride will end at the top of the hill on Birch Rd. Safety is the main concern on bikes. There will be no sprinting or passing until we leave the lake. The transistion area to running will be at the top of the hill. The run will go along the east shore, turn around at Kiloqua Rd., around the turnaround on the south shore, then finish at the Yacht Club.

Entry fee: Individual - \$10,00

Relay team - \$20.00

Categories: Individual - Person performs all three events.

Relay team - Male, female, mixed, and family. Each member performs a seperate leg (swim, bike, run)



Special Instructions:

- 2. Cyclists to stay on right of course at all times. Bikes should be in good working condition.
- 3. Water stations will be located along the running course.
