It would be wise for these rules to be posted in the rental cottages and for the owners to call them to the attention of their tenants. Three basic safety rules are: (1) always drive counter-clockwise around the lake, (2) when pulling a skier the driver must always also have an observer in the boat, (3) occupants of a boat must sit down on the seats, not on the sides or deck of the boat. If you disregard these rules you could receive a ticket.

whipped cream (optional)

very thick. Remove from heat and stir in butter and lemon juice. Cool. Place remaining 2 cups blueberrie in pie shell. Top with cooked blueberry mixture. Chill. Serve, garnished with whipped cream if desired !! Delicious !!


