

The tasks ahead of them were a 1/4 mile swim, 7 1/2 mile bike, and a 3 mile run. One by one they reached their goal, the finish line.

Last Sat. 15 individuals and 5 relay teams participated in Birch Lake Triathlon. They came to test themselves. the Dave Lovejoy used the swim to show everyone his state championship Out of the water fast after him were Pete Lovato and Bill form. Carpenter. Now comes the test of pulling yourself out of the water and preparing for the bike ride. Bob Ross was the 1st. cyclists on the course. Dave Lovejoy, Bob Ross and Dave Bussard were part of a relay team. Now came the hills. The faster you could ride up them the more you gain on the leaders. Carpenter caught Bob Ross at the 3 mile mark then at the 5 Bill mile mark Kurt Kruggel showed his winning form and took the lead. The moment of truth comes when you get off the bike and begin to run. Tom Troeger after a fast bike ride caught Bill on the hill to take over second spot, but there was still 3 miles ahead. Libby Troeger was now ready to show her winning form. She passed slower runners to finish 9th overall but the 1st. women. Dave Bussard showed a running form which brought his relay to 1st. overall by two minutes.

Many thanks goes to all the helpers and volunteers who made this a success. It took many people to start, finish, work the water stations and just be on the course cheering the triathletes on. My special thanks to Dan Reynolds for assuring me nothing would go wrong, and Bob Temple and Herm Kruggel for overseeing the race. Members of the Michiana Masters swim team were up for water safety.

...You can freeze hard cheeses?? Cheeses sliced or in a brick or wheel can be frozen to keep them fresh longer. Thaw in the refrigerator or at room temp, check before using to see if the color is even. Cheese that is still slightly frozen will have a spotted or splotchy appearance.

From the 1968 Barker: Daffy-nition:

Lake: a body of water where it is sometimes illegal to catch fish, but more often miraculous.

UNDERG HOUND RAILHOAD-- One of the principal greivances of the Southern Slave Owners before the Civil war was the Underground Railroad. Quakers from Pennsylvania came into Michigan and purchased sections of land around Birch Lake and Calvin Center. When the runaway slaves from the South were carried by the Underground into Michigan, a farm was given to them and many families have retained this lads to the present day. The Underground railway was a route over which the colored men and their familiess were carried on horseback or by wagon, after night from one station to another. These stations were usually about twenty miles apart. Two principal routes were used, one coming up from Cincinanati through Indiana and the other from St.Louis, Through Illinois. These two routesconverged just east of Cassopolis at the home of Stephen Bogue. A monument now marks this spot on route m 60, this was the Michigan terminal of the Underground railroad. Bogue and Josiah Osborne were the principal operators and the most important men in this undertaking. Osborne was located on the farm that is now known as Hilrings Lakeland Gardens. He operated a nursery here as far back as 1850, furnishing shade and fruit trees for the surrounding country. In 1947, slave owners from Equrbon County, Kentucky organized an expedition to come to Michigan to recover some of their runaway slaves. They arrived in the month of August and camped near Shavehead Lake. They knew exactly where the runaways were living as they had sent a spy up the previous winter. The spy had made maps and reported their location to the slave owners.....NEXT ISSUE CONT.

MEDICAL ADVICE, (from an article written by Shirley Ross Aug 1968.)


