COMMODORE'S COMMENTS

My big project during the past week, and one which has concerned me and my officers and directors all summer was the decision and planning of the new roof for the Yacht Club. The opinions of many members were solicited over the summer regarding the extent of our improvements. At our last board of directors meeting a building committee was formed to determine the proper method of construction. We considered (1) another new flat roof, (2) a new truss type roof with shingles, and (3) an unfinished second story with a trussed roof. After much thought and deliberation the committee decided upon a trussed roof with shingles having a 4/12 pitch. Should a second story be needed in the future, provisions are being made so the roof could be unbolted and raised. The committee believes that this is in the best interest of the Yacht Club at this time. We also met with the contractor and plans were made to do the work in the last week of September or first week of October. Therefore, we will have dry conditions in our building before the winter. Construction will not affect boat storage as the present roof will remain intact. This is a very necessary project, not extravagant but yet expensive (approximately \$7,500), therefore, I must ask all of you to be as generous as possible in your contribution to the Birch Lake Yacht Club Building Fund. Please send your contribution at once to either myself, Randy Welch, or our Treasurer, Lynn Schaar. Several people have already offered a generous contribution and I hope you will all join them.

Frank Horvath, our long time guardian of the Yacht Club, recently returned back to Birch Lake after a stay in the hospital. We all welcome you back! Frank said he had to get back in time to handle reservations for boat storage at the Yacht Club.

I was happy to see five MC's taking advantage of the good winds last Sunday. After checking with the sailors I found it was actually their 4th of July Regatta. Well better late than never! It was a first though as five boats are the largest ever in a Birch Lake only MC Regatta. The fleet is growing. Earl Troeger was the winner followed by Randy Welch, Bruce Harlan, Bud Lovejoy and Don Harmon in that order.

Tonight is the Annual Dinner and I hope all of you will be there to enjoy the good food and company of your lake neighbors. We will elect our new 1985 officers and present the Commodore's award.

This next article is taken from a 1975 Barker concerning Birch Lake. Beautiful Birch Lake lies at the head of the Matador Valley. The valley can best be enjoyed by a drive down Pine Tree Road. This is one of the many scenic drives around here. If you have not taken it you have missed one of the most beautiful sections of Southern Michigan. This road runs along the stately pines, through wooded sections to the hill overlooking Snake Creek. Stop at the top of the hill and enjoy this enchanting view. The willow and chestnut trees are a vivid contrast to the maples and beeches high in the hills.

Down the hill past the crossroads the roadway enters the norrows, a section of heavy timbers with the hills high on each side. You will have the impression of driving through a wooded fairyland. Notice the miniture water wheel and rock garden in the farm home yard on the right as you emerge from the narrows. One mile west is the sight of an early Michigan school which at one time was taught by Will Carlton, one of Michigan's famous poets. The road passes over a mill race on through sections of virgin timber to connect with U.S 112 east of Union. 1975 footnote--- The waterwheel is gone now but the wooded beauty is still

there for all to enjoy.

***Can any of you Birch Lake Residents remember this scenic view from long ago.


