

DID YOU KNOW? . . . Warning lables will soon appear on all aspirin and aspirin containing medicines, urging parents to consult a doctor before giving the medicine to children with chicken pox or flu. The new labeling is the result of a study that strongly associates aspirin use with Reye's syndrome, an uncommon illness that developes as a child is recovering from a viral infection. In addition to the warning, children's aspirin labels will no longer suggest use for flu.

SWIM LESSONS

There will be swim lessons offered again this summer on Eirch Lake. They will be from July 8-11 and July 15-18, with Fridays being the rain dates. Campho Phenique works fantastic to relieve the itching due to bug bites or poison ivy, etc. Just take a cotton ball with campho phenique and gently dab the affected area. Also for effective and fast results, try a paste mixture of accent salt and water on bee or wasp swellings.

- 2 - 3oz packages of cream cheese

Melt in top of double boiler - cream cheese, cheddar cheese and butter. Fold in beaten egg whites. Remove crust from bread - cut into 1 inch squares. Dip cubes into warm cheese mix and freeze on cookie sheets. Just before serving, pop into a 400 degree oven for 10 min. until puffy and brown - makes 90 cubes, approx.




