RECIPE IDEA the following recipe was given to us by Ruth Brown, Westside.

Cherry Pie

Crust for 2 pies (lattice tops)

1 cup shortening (crisco)

3 cups sifted flour

1½ tsp salt (prefer 3/4 tsp)

2 cup cold water.

Sift flour and salt. Cut shortening into flour. Sprinkle water over mixture. Form in balls & roll between wax paper.

Filling for each pie: 21 cups sour cherries

3/4 - 1 cup sugar

4 TBL flour

sift together sugar and flour and pour over cherries. Add 2 TEL butter, cut in small chunks. Add tsp almond extract. Pour into pastry shell & top with lattice top. Bake in 425 degree oven for 15 min. Reduce temp to 400 degree and bake until browned and the juice bubbles! Absolutely the most delicious pie you've tasted!!

SOME HISTORY OF BIRCH LAKE. . The area around Birch Lake was held by the Potawatomic Indians who were headed by Big Chief Pokagon and Under-Chiefs Weesaw and Shavehead. While Pokagon was a very brilliant man, making friends of the white man and accepting the white man's ways and teachings, Shavehead was the opposite. He was a large man for an Indian, very ugly and very mean. He gained his name by keeping his head shaved, which did nothing to improve his appearance. Shavehead's winter quarters was around Shavehead Lake and in the summer he migrated to what is now Mottville, where there was a ford across the St. Joseph River. This ford was on the Sauk Trail, which is now modern U.S. 12. Shavehead would camp at the ford and extract a fee from the white settlers for use of the crossing. It is reported that he discontinued this practice only after a young burly settler had taken his ox whip and thrashed Shavehead within an inch of his life.



BIRCH LAKE TRIATHLON

Remember Aug. 4th of last year. Remember the fun, the great time, the enjoyment of competition. Or maybe you remember the pain. Either way the second annualBirch Lake Triathlon is coming Aug. 10th. It's time to live up to that promise "I'll do that next year". Even if your training has not started yet, it's not to late to start. The distances will remain the same from last year, so find your running shoes and pump some air in those tires. Finding someone to train with will it seem alot easier.

The course consists of a $\frac{1}{4}$ mile swim, $7\frac{1}{2}$ mile bike, and a 3 mile run. Many volenteers again will be needed this year to help. This is a good way to watch the race and also be a part of it. Questions can be answered by Bill Carpenter or Dan Reynolds.

The swim will start at Welch's cottage and go to Carpenter's. The area will be inside the rafts so water depth will not be a problem. Boats will be in the area for assistance if needed. Bikes will be along the road behind Carpenter's. The ride will go to the public beach, then up the hill following Birch Rd. to Shavehead Rd. Down Shavehead to Robbins Lake Rd. which will be the turn around point. The ride will end at the top of the hill on Birch Rd. Safety is the main concern on bikes. There will be no sprinting or passing until we leave the lake. The transistion area to running will be at the top of the hill. The run will go along the east shore, turn around at Kiloqua Rd., around the turnaround on the south shore, then finish at the Yacht Club.

Entry fee: Individual - \$10.00

Relay team - \$20.00

Categories: Individual - Person performs all three events.

Relay team - Male, female, mixed, and family. Each member performs a seperate leg (swim, bike, run)

Awards: All individuals and relay teams will recieve a shirt along with post race refreshments. Top female & male, and age group winners will recieve awards.

Age groups will be determined upon entries. Awards to be given out at conclusion of race at the Yacht Club.

Special Instructions:

- 1. Swimmers may wear goggles. Floatation devices may be worn if needed.
- 2. Cyclists to stay on right of course at all times. Bikes should be in good working condition.
- 3. Water stations will be located along the running course.
- 4. Safety should be everyones top priorityA serious injury would hamper the enjoyment of this event. We are out there to win but also to enjoy!
