

#### LAST CALL ON SAILING FEES


Only the sailors who have paid their dues by 8-3 will be carried on the roster and will be eligible for trophies.

continuation of the history of Birch Lake . . . Shavehead was responsible for the deaths of many white settlers. He would promise to secure game for the white man, but no one returned from the hunting trips but Chief Shavehead. Strangely enough, he met his death the same way. He was at the Trading Post, which is now Cassopolis, drunk and bragging about his participation in the Fort Dearborn massacre. Shavehead was overheard by a young trapper who had lost his wife and child in the debachery. The young trapper was then living on the Island in Diamond Lake. He asked Shavehead to go home with him. A shot was heard, and Chief Shavehead was never seen again.

The Indians under Chief Weesaw, whose winter quarters were in the vicinity of Newton's Woods , joined Chief Shavehead's band in the early spring around Eirch Lake, where they bathed in the lake and drank of its water, claiming the water had great healing gover. It is recorded that Chief Pokagon, who was ill, made the journey from his home near Summerville for this purpose.
