

TRASH BURNING ETTIQUETTE

If burning of trash is necessary at your Birch Lake residence listed below are a few helpful hints that will enable you to maximize your efforts!

- 1. Always wait for the wind direction to blow away from your property.
- Inspect your neighbors home to be sure all his/her windows are raised fully.
 For maximum effectiveness try and burn on a day that has a 1-3 mile wind
- velocity and high humidity that will enable the smoke to hang and permeate all of those around you.
- 4. Among the paper you are burning be sure to sprinkle freely food particles and other particulate matter so that you might reach an optimum foul odor that will remain for days.
- 5. Do not use a trash pick up service it will allow your neighbors a pollutant free atmosphere that we might all enjoy and besides \$6 per month is excessive.



BIRCH LAKE CEMETERY HISTORY The foundation of a small wooden building near Birch Lake is involved in quite a bit of history. The frame building that once stood there was the Friends Meeting House and was built in 1856.

The first Quakers in Cass County held meetings for worship in the home of Wm. and Rachel East. A log meeting house was built in 1857. Nineteen years later the present white frame house was built on the site of the log

building. The land on which it was built was deeded in that year to the meeting by Joel and Sarah East. At the same time, James and Anna East deeded an acre which apparently included the burying ground across from the Meeting House.

In 1846, the first meeting for worship of Birch Lake Meeting began to meet in the home of Isaac Bonine on Young's Prairie. After Prairie Grove built its own meeting house in 1848, monthly business meetings were held alternately at Penn and Birch Lake. It was out of this meeting that Penn Friends Church grew.

The Cass County Friends became involved with the Underground Railroad while trying to remove themselves from slavery. Their position near the border states and their reputation as a community of practicing Christians involved the slaves. The folklore of the Underfround Railroad includes Cass County Quakers as conductors and their homes as stations. TO BE CONTINUES IN THE NEXT ISSUE
