The August directors meeting was held last Monday. Following are some of the major topics discussed:


- The Nominating Committee assured the board it would have a complete slate of officers and directors available for nomination at the annual meeting.

LABOR DAY REGATTA


We will sail the Labor Day Regatta on August 31 and September 1. Weather and winds permitting there will be 3 races Saturday and 2 on Sunday.

INTERESTING FACTS. . . .

Recently I became very interested in the early beginnings of Birch Lake and decided to contact a few people around the different shores to glean some information! I started with the East Shore but I would like to print something about each of the shores concerning the first cottages and other interesting memories you may have to share! If anyone can help me in any way I would really appreciate it - just call me.

East Shores - around the 1920's - Genevieve Lagoni's grandfather, Henry Sears, owned the farm from the Public Beach to the Haines cottate. Ruhl Harvy owned the cottage that is now Bernaciak's - his farm property started at Haines and went to Bernaciak's.

In 1923 Thelma(Koontz) and Helen(Weesner), sisters, had a picnic on the shores of the East side with their parents when along came Mr. Darling, from Darling Realty from Elkhart, selling the newly plotted property that they were picnicing on. Thelma & Helen's family bought their property in 1923 and built in 1924, the house that Thelma & Leo live in now.

Genevieve Lagoni's grandfather had taken a "wing" from the family farm, which is now the Manning Farm on Birch Road and had it moved down the hill to sit on the location that is now the Lagoni cottage on Birch Lake. (early 1926). There was a small house that stood across the street from Hansen's on Birch Rd. that was called the tenants house, (where people who worked on the farm lived) (this farm then belonged to Genevieve's great grandmother's family) that was also moved down to the lake about this time, and this cottage became Larson's, which is Genevieve's cousin. Genevieve's grandfather also had a boathouse at Sear's Park. Left of Sear's Park land all belonged the the Palmer Farm.

1900's - There was a brick building where the ceramic shop is located now in Williamsville that burned to the ground and then it was rebuilt and owned by White's. Later Lanky Breece bought it from the White's and it was the local grocery store. Yvonne (Purdy) Breece, Lanky's wife, had a father who celebrated his 101 th birthday about 25 years or so ago - he painted pictures of this lake and some people may still have some of his pictures. In 1925 or 26 Lanky had an ice storage building right where the Powell cottage is, South of Sears Park. Ed Lowe's father used to have an ice truck that he would deliver ice to people in the area. (Kitty-Litter founder)

In 1923 when Thelma & Helen first came to Birch Lake they had a 6 foot sandy beach in front of their cottage - until the dam was built and the water level was raised. Thelma & Helen had a nice sailboat with two sails that they used to sail around the lake on - after they taught themselves how to operate it!

There used to be a big log cabin back on the hill close to where the Went's cottage is steps went up the hill to the log cabin, it had no windows and the only thing left in
the cabin was a very old cradle. Thelma & Helen used to go in the woods there and find
arrowheads and once even found a Tomahawk!


