The agenda included Water Quality, Yacht Club Improvements, Long Term Improvements, Fireworks, Permits and Insurance, Activities, and Sailing.

The annual dues have been raised to \$20 a year which barely covers the Yacht Club expenses, insurance and taxes, which were raised 40% last year as most of us are well aware.

FIREWORKS ON THE 4TH, Sailing, and Activities are all supported by themselves and are not subsidized with your Yacht Club dues. Your participation is all the response needed to continue these fun Birch Lake activities. Of course you have to pay to play, and the more that play the less we pay, its just that simple.

Mailers were sent out this year for collection of dues. 76 families have already responded getting us off to a good start, but you can be sure your director will be stopping by for a cup of coffee if by chance you misplaced the mailer or perhaps you are a new resident and we don't know you as yet.

Jerry Ferry from Princess Fireworks came by to explain what has been happening with our displays over the last 5 years. We have been operating on a fixed budget and not taking into account any inflation factor which translates into reducing our GREAT BALLS OF FIRE from 143 in 1981 to 96 in 1986. After discussing several options with Jerry Perry it was moved and seconded to increase our fireworks expenditure from \$1000 to \$1800, which should give us an excellent display. Of course if we should raise more than \$1800 the extra funds could be added to our display as late as showtime. Soooooo let's talk it up with the neighbors and make this years display one of our best!!!!

The Water Quality Committee has been given an operating budget of \$500 for 1987. This is no where near the amount required to protect our natural resource but just enough to keep everyone informed. There will be a mailer sent very soon relating to the daily testing that is taking place around the lake at several hot spots. Please take this information seriously for this is not someone else's problem its OURS.

Everyone seems to have an old story about Birch but no one seems to know them all, so here's your chance to get yourself published. If you have any information please give it to your news collector.



CASS COUNTY HEALTH DEPARTMENT BIRCH LAKE SURVEY PROGRAM

Dear Birch Lake Residents:

There is a need for a report to clarify any misunderstandings in regard to the <u>Birch</u> <u>Lake Survey Program</u>. A brief report will be mailed to you individually. From the beginning of the sewage pollution problem at Birch Lake it was and still is a residential problem. The Birch Lake Survey Program was designed by Owen Gordon, Administrator, and Lee Maager, Director Environmental Health. The Health Department was and still is concerned with the overall condition of Birch Lake: bacteriological and mutrient.

The Health Department concentrated their efforts on nutrient contamination:

- At the request of the Health Department the DNR collected nutrient water samples.
- The DNR provided the Health Department with laboratory assistance for sampling nutrients.
- The Health Department collected partial chemical water samples.
- The Health Department took oxygen tests of the lake.

- The Health Department concentrated their efforts on bacteriological contamination:

 The Health Department requested and has the permission of 100 per cent of the Birch Lake residents to inspect the sewage disposal system servicing the dwelling to determine if the system is contributing to the contamination of the lake.
 - On-site inspections of every lakefront and stream property has been completed, inspections documented - sources of pollution pinpointed.

The Health Department established a water monitoring program as part of a long-term management program with the Birch Lake Yacht Club Water Quality Committee:

- Nutrient water samples will be tested on instruments furnished by the Health Department upon collection by 9 stations assisting the committee. This testing equipment meets EPA requirements.
- Bacteriological water samples are collected weekly by 9 stations assisting the committee. They are mailed by the Health Department to the Laboratory, MI Department of Public Health - evaluated by the Health Department.

Septic systems at Birch Lake continue to seep phosphorus - residential nutrient loading still exists. Septic systems at Birch Lake continue to emit semi-treated sewage and pathogens to the lake - a health menace still exists. Coliforms are high in the lake and in the stream. Evidence of dumpings continue.

The Cass County Health Department Birch Lake Survey Program will continue under the direction of Mr. Lee Maager. The Birch Lake Yacht Club Water Quality Committee serves as the laison with the Health Department. This committee will continue to work with them to correct the residential phosphorus and residential coliform pollution problem. Corrections have been made. More corrections will be made. Criteria has been set to stop the pollution problem for Birch Lake residents - the majority of whom want the destruction of the lake stopped.

Many problems have been faced since the beginning of the history of the residential sewage pollution problem at Birch Lake. Special help has been given to Birch Lake by the Cass County Health Department. We are greatful to them and to their Birch Lake Survey Program. They are giving our lake back to us.
