



CASS COUNTY HEALTH DEPARTMENT BIRCH LAKE SURVEY PROGRAM

Dear Birch Lake Residents:

On June 1, 1987 you were informed by the Birch Lake Yacht Club Water Quality Committee that there is a need for a report to clarify any misunderstandings in regard to the <u>Birch Lake Survey Program</u> and the residential sewage pollution problem at Birch Lake.

A 5-page report is being mailed to you individually through the courtesy of the Birch Lake Yacht Club and the Cass County Health Department. Assisting Fran Welch with the addressing of the envelopes: Betty Mitchell and daughter, Nancy. Barb Zesinger. Nadine Brown. Linda Curtis and daughter, Karen. The water quality committee and the Health Department also appreciate the generous donation from the family on the East shore of Birch Lake. Their contribution helped finance the printing and the mailing of the report. Thank you.

<u>The Birch Lake Survey Program</u> is under the direction of Mr. Lee Maager, Director Environmental Health. The report states that the Health Department has inspected 176 lakefront and stream properties and categorizes the documented inspections. Mr. Maager is mailing a letter to those of you who made committments to take the appropriate measures on your property to correct deficiencies in your sewage disposal system. He states, "The sooner these corrections are identified and completed, the sooner the lake will be able to begin recovering from the impact of the malfunctioning, or improperly located sewage disposal systems."

Mr. Maager also states, "Summer is upon us already, and much remains to be done on the Birch Lake program which has been a priority for the Cass County Health Department the past two years." He continues, "A great deal of time and effort has already gone into the Birch Lake program, and it is important that it is carried out to its conclusion in order to show concrete results."

The Health Department is thankful for your cooperation and continued support as is the Birch Lake Yacht Club Water Quality Committee.
