NEW YORKER IS DRAWN BACK TO BIRCH LAKE.

Excitement mounts when we hit the Indiana Toll Road, and by the time we pass through Constantine, they are going over the rules for the annual "I see Birch Lake First game...

Because my grandparents came to Birch Lake over 50 years ago, four generations of my family have spent their summers here. Birch is special to us and we like to think that it is unique among lakes. But it is more than just the lake that pulls me back here each year. It is the people and the landscape.

The people in the Michiana area have a certain quality that I need to draw from each year. People here seem to have their feet on the ground. No one goes up sixty stories in a skyscraper to go to work. And they don't spend their days trying to second guess Wall Street or faxing messages to someone they have never met in Japan. Michiganders have something concrete to show for their day's work. They build cars, trailers, or musical instruments. Farmers grow the food that will feed the rest of us. And so their lives seem more solid, more genuine to me. No one here has ever asked me to come admire their latest piece of

pre-Columbian ort work, but dear neighors have asked me over to admire and then sample their prize-winning cherry pie. I want my children to learn of the graciousness behind the offer of a homemade work of art. I want them to learn to revel, as I do, in the conversation that centers not on distant global events but on local human concerns such as Mrs. Haine's health and Annie's new baby.

After the people, it is the landscape that draws me back. Do you residents see the beauty in your weathered barns with pressed tin roofs? I do. And the sight of rolling fields of wheat swaying in the summer breeze never fails to remind me that this is the heartland of America. Out there are strawberry patches, cherry orchards, and black raspberries that grow wild along the side of the road. Yes, my children, these things really do come from bushes and trees instead of off the shelves at the

grocery store. There are giant oak and hickory trees here just asking to be climbed. And yesterday at dusk we saw two deer and a family of rabbits. After that, the moon rose full across the lake and beat a silvery path to my window.

Yes, Michiana, I will always be willing to drive eight hundred miles to surround myself with your people and your incredible beauty. I need these seven weeks to recharge my worn out batteries, to soak up your goodness.

Thank you, folks, for sharing your blessing with me.

RECIPE OF THE WEEK


This is the time of the year when everyone seems to have at least 5 extra zuchinni to give away. This next recipe is an excellent way to conceal zuchinni and still be able to eat it!!

Zuchinni Bread

Beat 3 eggs until frothy Add 2 cups of sugar - 1 cup white and 1 cup packed brown sugar Add 1 cup vegetable oil Add 1 tablespoon vanilla Beat this until thick and lemon looking in color. Stir in 2 cups coarsely ground zuchinni (packed loosely and unpeeled)

Add 2 cups flour, 1 tablespoon cinnamon, 2 teaspoons baking soda, 1 teaspoon salt and 1/8 teaspoon baking powder. Fold in 1 cup of chopped nuts. Grease and flour (I even put greased wax paper in the bottoms of the pans to prevent any sticking) 2 loaf pans - 8 1/2 X 4 1/2 inch pans.

Bake at 350 degrees for 55 to 60 minutes.
