

RECIPE OF THE WEEK

WATER QUALITY REPORT AUGUST 1989


In our Spring 1989 report we ware looking forward to progress this summer and we have made good progress as is evident from the progress map. As it now stands the totals are:

- 37 Sewage Systems in Substantial Non-compliance
 - 11 Permits issued for corrective action

26 Sewage Systems need attention !!

The Cass County Health Department has sent a number of letters regarding each of the systems needing attention. The responsibility to take action is totally that of the property owner. Time is running short. Once again I strongly urge those remaining property owners to take action just as most of the rest have. 
