WATER SAFETY

It is becoming quite evident that a review of the boating rules is necessary for the ever increasing number of wave riders and jet skis. Numerous Michigan laws are ignored everyday. The majority of violations seem to come from guests using these water vehicles. If you are going to allow other people to use your wave riders, please thoroughly explain the rules to them, because <u>you</u> are liable should an accident occur. Here are a few examples of things people have been observed doing:

- 1. Racing side by side within a few feet of each other.
- Jumping the wake with two very small children on the watercraft, one in front and one in back of the driver.
- 3. Playing chicken in the middle of the lake.
- 4. Using the watercraft to spray swimmers.
- 5. Driving while facing the opposite direction.

Let's try to abide by these very simple rules:

- If you want to "play" or "hot dog" on the watercraft, do so in the middle of the lake and not within 100 feet of any other watercraft (including wave riders and jet skis).
- Operate the craft in a counter clockwise direction at all times with no sudden turns or spins.
- 3. Stay 100 feet from docks, piers, people and boats.
- Observe the courtesy rules of the lake. Do not use the wave riders or jet skis before 10:00 a.m. or after 7:00 p.m.

Please use common sense. Let's not make a tragic accident force us to realize how dangerous these machines can be if operated in a wreckless manner. Water Safety Comm.

So be a good neighbor: refrain from bathing in the lake and throwing tobacco in the lake.
