MEMORIES OF BIRCH LAKE BY BARBARA (BOVIK) WALLIN - While at Birch Lake this summer, I enjoyed reading some of the lake's history provided by Helen Weesner and Earl Troeger, so thought I would add a little of my own.

Birch Lake has played an intregal part in my family for over 70 years. Somewhere around 1921 my Father's fraternity brother became lost in Michigan and while meandering around a corn field, he came upon Birch Lake, Lazy Lodge and Mrs. King, who obligingly told him how to find his way back to Chicago and all about the beauty and wonderful clear water. That started our love affair with Birch Lake. At that time there were very few cottages at the lake, for instance Harvey's stone house, Lazy Lodge and cabins and Thayer's. I have a picture of Lazy Lodge and the Dance pavillion where every Saturday night the folks in the area would come and dance. I also have a picture of the biggest string of fish, big bass, that Dad and "Uncle Bill" caught back then in the 1920's. Mom and Dad rented a cabin from Mrs. King for their honeymoon in 1923; I think the name of that particular cabin was "Dewdrop Inn." Many summers our vacation was spent at Lazy Lodge until we finally bought our own cottage in 1938.

Historically, Birch Lake is quite a place. We all know Chief Shavehead brought his tribe to the lake, but how many realize that they came there because they believed it was healing waters. This could easily be true; my grandmother would sit and dangle her feet in the lake at the end of the pier and swore her bunions disappeared!

I was told that the East shore's Indian name was Nun-U-Ku-Muk, which translated meant the "breezy side of Birch."

Most interesting of all, it seems that there was a back man in Williamsville who was a powerful swimmer and said he would swim under a shelf on the East side and there was an old wagon. In the 1950's some divers from Michigan State University brought this old wagon up. I took my children to watch and took a picture as the tongue and front wheels came up. I told Bill and Sharon the story that during the Civil War Quakers would bring slaves to freedom in Cass County and Quantrell's Raiders caught them with an empty wagon on the road along the lake, took the wagon pushed it out on the ice and it sunk. They told the Quakers that that was one wagon they would never use for the purpose again. The divers told me this story and it was my understanding the wagon would be in a museum at the University.

As I write this I am flooded with memories we all share of Billyville, Lanky, Ed Lowe delivering ice, free movies, etc. and in our youth we seemed to have made a bit of our own history; I came to this conclusion because Monkey Run is now a street with that name on the street sign! Also our Birch Lake Yacht Club was responsible for the only barn in Michigan with a sailing mural on the wall. Our first dance was there and Mrs. Challinor painted the mural.

Over the years, I have lived in different places but Birch Lake is the true place of my heart.

100' DISTANCES FOR NO-WAKE ZONES BY DAN REYNOLDS - A number of our members have expressed concern over reckless operation of motorcraft - including personal watercraft too close to their shoreline, especially when those craft endanger swimmers.



It is illegal to operate any craft within 100 feet from the shoreline, the end of a dock, or any moored raft or boat (except for landing or embarking at dead slow speed). A violator can be arrested and convicted.

Members concerned about boats and personal watercraft operating above no wake speed within the 100 feet limit may position specially marked standard mooring buoys to indicate the boundaries of the required stand-off distance. Any standard legal mooring buoy, white with a horizontal blue strip, can be designated a "100 foot marker" by adding six inch black stars on both sides of the upper portion of the buoy. Whether used for boat mooring without the star or a marker with the star, this is the only type of buoy that can be placed without a DNR permit.

Mooring buoys are available at most marine stores. A manufacturer that will sell direct is Rolyan Buoys, 1-800-228-3693. Model B1145 is adequate and costs \$65. Rolyan accepts Visa & MC.

Suggestion: This protective measure can be most effective when two or more continuous neighbors post 100 feet markets, creating an effective line of reference to protect their combined waterfronts.



COURTESY RULE FOR PERSONAL WATERCRAFT - Birch Lake will again ask that operators of personal watercraft observe the Lake rule that such watercraft will not be operated before 9am or 7pm (Indiana time). This allows residents to enjoy mornings and evenings in quiet.


As a resident, please inform guests and renters of this rule. Also inform guests and renters of the Michigan laws governing boating.




Note: The Camp is making arrangements to have the building removed, however, the date is not in the immediate future.
