SAILING NEWS - Thirteen sailors from our two fleets sailed in last Sunday's two races.

The first race was very competitive with all boats finishing within two minutes of each other. Scott Troeger won the Sunfish race, Tom Howard finished 2nd, and Ric Harman, John Gableman and Bob King combined for a photo finish for 3rd: Ric nosed out John and Bob. Dave Troeger nosed out Harold Cranmer and Tom Troeger in the MC race, in that order.

There was a little more spread in the 2nd race. Scott Troeger and Tom Howard finished 1-1 in the Sunfish while Dave Troeger and Don Harman were 1-2 in the MC's.

Congratulations to all the sailors for some very good racing. Dave Olson and Mike Machalleck also sailed well as did Dick Green and Bruce Harlan.

If you watch the races, the first leg is always sail into the wind to the windward mark. They will also finish at the windward mark. We will sail either 1 1/3 times or 2 1/3 times around the course. The MC's start 1st, five minutes ahead of the Sunfish so there are two races going on at the same time.

The sailors ask that we keep the large waves from our speedboats to a minimum during the races, especially near the marks. The races last approximately two hours between 10:30 and 12:30, Sunday mornings. We thank you for your consideration.
