Darrel L. King, Institute of Water Research, Michigan State University Recommends ways to a cleaner lake: If we fertifize our lake, we increase phosphorus and nitrogen which means more rapid and abundant growth of plant life !!!! Lakes are as uniquely different as individuals. Rates and extents of natural eutrophication depend upon what influence man has on a lake with the input of nutrients such as phosphorus and nitrogen. "People stir things up fiercely," said Mr. King. He added further that eutrophication depends upon plants. As we add more phosphorus, plants get greener, die, sink to the bottom and add more nutrients. Bluegreen algae are bad. They don't have the decency to sink. In abundance, they become a scum, rot down, and smell like a pig pen. Increased phosphorus increases weeds and algae and decrease oxygen and could result in no fish and a take over of the bluegreen algae. Note: Ray J. White, Department of Fisheries and Wildlife, Michigan State University stated that we must correct the sources of phosphorus rather than wait until corrective measures will no longer help.
