

HOMEOWNERS' ASSOCIATION NEWS

The Constantine Public Schools school board recently voted to approve an approximately \$24,750,000 construction program which, if approved by the voters, will add approximately 9.16 mills to the property tax bills of most Birch Lake homeowners for the next 30 years. All of Birch Lake, except the West side and the Cove, is in the Constantine Public Schools district. The proposed construction program includes \$22,626,751 (about 8.2 mills in property taxes) for new additions to and remodelling of Eastside Elementary and Riverside Elementary, constructing a new high school and converting the existing high school to a middle school, and also \$2,131,500 (about 96 mills) for a new 600 seat auditorium. A public vote to consider this matter has not yet been scheduled, but will likely take place in late August or September.

To estimate the effect of a property tax millage increase, divide the market value of the affected property by two, then multiply by the number of "mills" (each mill is one one - thousandth, or .001) to get the annual tax increase, and finally multiply that by the number of years the millage increase is to be in effect. For example, if a property has a \$150,000 market value, the formula is \$150,000 / 2 = $$75,000 \times .00916 = 687 per year x 30 years = \$20,610. This amount would be in addition to the existing tax bill.

In 1995 the Constantine Public Schools proposed an approximately \$18,000,000 construction program which would have resulted in a 7.9 mill property tax increase, but that was rejected by the voters by a nearly 3 to 1 margin. School boards are permitted to propose millage increases to the voters as frequently as every six months, and more frequently if the amount requested differs from the previous request by more than 15%.

The Constantine Public Schools had a 1995 - 1996 enrollment of 1,671, while the state average was 2,909. Constantine's high school had 477 students, the middle school 372, Eastside elementary 415 and Riverside elementary 405 in 1995 -1996. (Those numbers don't add up to the total, but they are the official figures.) The current Constantine Public Schools school board members are Steve Curtis, Neil Ketner, Marla King, Marcia Miller, Dan Reynolds and Sandy Russel. Based on the most recent data found, in Cass County, Michigan the burden of property tax millage increases is borne by the following categories of property as follows: residential = 67%; agricultural = 17%; industrial = 3%; commercial = 6%; and "other" = 8%. This statistical information regarding Constantine Public Schools and Cass County, Michigan was obtained through the State of Michigan and University of Michigan internet sites.
