This may have been the coldest 4th of July on record, but the Founding Fathers would be pleased to know that Birch Lake carried on with the fireworks display, boat parade and pancake breakfast with the fortitude and undaunted spirit that overcame the rigors of Valley Forge. The efforts of the organizers and participants are greatly appreciated, with special thanks to Claudia Gableman for organizing the Boat Parade and to Sue Wagner (Commodore emeritus) for undertaking the Pancake Breakfast benefit for Camp Tannadonnah. 




# FLEET NEWS
